LAMB, BLACK PUDDING AND PORTER BEER PIE WITH A THYME LID



Pie mix:

2lb diced lamb

200g black pudding

I onion, chopped

I tspn tomato paste

I pint Porter beer (I use Naylors from Cross Hills)

3/4 pint water

I fresh sprig thyme

salt and pepper to season

Pastry:

8oz plain flour 4oz butter

I egg yolk

I onion, chopped 1/2 tspn thyme

water to bind

. To make the pie mix: put all the ingredients into a pan and slow cook for an hour and a half, until the meat is really tender.

 To make the pastry: mix the flour and soft butter with the egg yolk. Add the onions, thyme and seasoning. Add water to bind if needed.

 When the pie mix is ready, transfer to a flat, deep dish, roll the pastry to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick and put on top of the pie. Cook in the oven at 180 degree C for 40 mins (until the pastry is cooked) Serve with chips or vegetables.

weeks of overindulgence and inactivity, it can be unrealistic to launch into a fitness scheme that involves doing 50 sit ups before bed every night and running at least 3 times a week, even in the best of conditions. REVIEW The Railway Children

come from the audience. To get us in the mood we were treated to the sounds of shunting steam engines, but how do you recreate the sights of the Worth Valley Railway on a stage? Easy. A gigantic video screen backdrop was used

to display beautifully shot scenes of the railway and cast, bringing Edith Nesbitt's classic tale to life.

From behind the huge clouds of "steam" that engulfed the stage Perks strode on to the platform and after a loud blast on his whistle proceeded to narrate the

story of Bobbie, Phyllis and Pete and how they came to arrive in the village of Oakworth. The local cast were excellent and a special mention must go to the little lad playing Perk's youngest who won over the hearts of the audience with a fearless performance. For this matinee show I

> decided to take my young children who were already huge fans of the film and were making their first visit to a theatre. They were totally enraptured by the production which, like the film, managed to appeal to all ages.

Given the limitations of stage.

the infamous landslide scene was well recreated with foliage and rubble and the children saved the day again. Judging by the thunderous applause at the end this was a very popular production. Let's hope it makes another return to Keighley Playhouse.

Up On The Roof...

Solar photovoltaic (PV) panels are lightweight and fairly unobtrusive and can



be fitted to either traditional roofs, flat roofs, walls or floor-mounted in the garden. The DC (Direct Current) electricity created is converted into usable power AC (Alternating Current) via a wall-mounted inverter in the attic. It then runs through a generation meter to be up and running well within a week of installation.

Mr. Jagan, a local resident in Stanbury, had PV solar panels installed on his roof last year and has been generating his own electricity since. He receives a quarterly cheque for the Feed In Tariff from his utility company and is pleased with the scheme. 

Cotton on to Fairtrade and take action for trade justice

Do you know that your everyday shopping purchases can help trade justice? It's simple and easy to do - just look for products with the Fairtrade logo and buy these. Not only will you ensure that farmers in developing countries receive a fair and stable price for their products, but you will be contributing to a social premium that the farmers' democratically elected representatives decide how to spend:

eg a new water well, health clinic, solar street lamps or business training.

To quote Moussa Keita, a Fairtrade cotton farmer in Mali "Since selling our cotton as Fairtrade, we are able to eat every day and all my children go to school. With the premium we have built two classrooms".

Over 4,500 products now carry the Fairtrade logo. There's a huge selection of Fairtrade teas, coffees and chocolate. but did you know that you can also buy a wide range of fruit (not just bananas), wine, honey, biscuits, herbs and spices, ice cream, sports balls, beauty products, olive

oil, rice, nuts, flowers, cereal bars, cotton wool, cotton clothing and much more...

If your church, school or local shop is not already using Fairtrade products you can encourage them to make the switch. This will help them meet some of the criteria for becoming a 'Fairtrade church'. 'Fairtrade school'. or 'Fairtrade town'.

> The Fairtrade Foundation is responsible for Fairtrade in the UK and co-ordinates the Fairtrade church. town and school schemes. Bradford is a Fairtrade Zone and has active Fairtrade 'town' groups such as Shipley, Bingley,

Haworth, Thornton, Burley, Baildon and Ilklev. Fairtrade Bradford would like to see the diocese become a 'Fairtrade diocese' where 50% of the churches are registered as a 'Fairtrade church'. Fairtrade Fortnight 2011 will run from 28th Feb - 13th March. The theme is 'Show off your label' with a special focus on Fairtrade cotton.

We rely on cotton every day and an

estimated 100 million rural households. in 65 countries around the world rely on producing cotton to get them through today and hopefully through tomorrow. Two thirds of cotton is produced in developing countries and cotton makes up 40% of West Africa's export income. Small scale farmers have to face unstable and low



prices as cheap, subsidised cotton from China, the US and EU is dumped on world markets. Europe, China and America pay \$4.8 billion annually in subsidies to their cotton farmers. African and Indian cotton farmers are simply not able to compete.

Fairtrade Fortnight 2011 aims to create the world's longest string of bunting.

The Fairtrade Foundation is providing free Fairtrade cotton bunting kits to decorate. The bunting will be sent to the World Trade Organisation Ministerial Meeting in Nov 2011 to show the UK's support for Fairtrade and trade justice for the farmers behind the label.

Fairtrade Bradford would like to gather all the district's decorated bunting for a mass photo at 2pm on Saturday, 12th March on Darley Street, Bradford. Karen Palframan, chair of Fairtrade Bradford and a member of St. John's Ben Rhydding, said:

"We want to show the whole Bradford district that we care about trade justice and want action taken to address the issues that keep so many people poor"





Is The Railway Worth it?

The Railway in the Worth Valley has been here since 1867. It closed 50 years ago this year and was re-opened by the Preservation Society in 1967. Some people consider it a nuisance, especially when they have to wait at the level crossings and some think it is just a big boy's toy for a group of eccentric blokes who have never grown up. But what is it Worth? Local people living in BD20, BD21 & BD22 can travel at half fare with a local resident's card but The Railway has no system to record where the passengers are from. I know, because I have asked for postcodes on our Steam Galas that these events attract people from every corner of the UK and we hear that every hotel and guest house for miles around is fully booked.



I also know, from asking personally that during the summer people arrive from all over Europe in addition to Australia, Canada, The USA and the Far East. Last summer a gentleman flew from Cape Town especially to take part in one of our Guided Tours.

But how much do they spend? The United Kingdom Tourism survey for 2010 calculates that the average tourist in the UK spent £65.00 per day and the average spend per trip was £195.00. Over the year the Railway carries some 60,000 passengers. If every one of these was a tourist who also stayed in the area for the weekend, then The Railway would be contributing the fantastic sum of almost £12million to the local economy each year. But realistically, we can assume that half our passengers are local people, i.e. within an hours drive and only spend money at



The Railway. Of the rest, two thirds will probably visit for the day and spend money in local cafes, pubs and shops. The other third, I estimate, will stay in the area for the weekend and also spend money in hotels, restaurants, and other places. This calculation then means the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway is contributing some £3,250,000 into the local economy. On top of that, it has always been Society policy to buy its own supplies, wherever possible, in the local area, so you can probably increase the previous figure up to £4,000,000.

So next time that your car is held up for two minutes at Oakworth crossing, just remember all those happy tourists leaning from the train windows are helping your friends and neighbours if not you directly.

Chocolate Seduction

Warm, rich, sensuous and exciting

- what more could you want for

Valentine's day? And you will be able to
delight your loved one with this delicious
treat even if your exploits in the kitchen
have only ever extended to a quick kiss
while the kettle boils.

Its not only the ingredients which quicken the pulse (2 bars of chocolate, half a small tub of double cream, alcohol, fruit and fudge) but the fact that you can get down and dirty with them; melting, stirring, oozing and even smearing if thats where your fancy takes you....

Chop up a selection of your loved ones favourite soft fruits into bite sized chunks; strawberries, mango, pineapple, bananas, cherries, and a few chunks of fudge or chewy toffee too. Cover with cling film until the moment is right.

Now dim the lights and light the candles. Break 200g chocolate into pieces and put in a bowl with half a small tub of cream (about 75 ml). Microwave on about half power for a minute, take out and stir and then repeat. Stir well until the chocolate melts into the cream, and add two or three tablespoons of alcohol. Baileys, brandy and whisky work well.

Get another bowl a bit smaller than the first and fill half way with boiling water. When you put the chocolate bowl on top of this bowl, it will keep the chocolate soft and warm. (If this bit is beyond you, just buy a fondue set, which you will never use again)

Take the cling film off the fruit, set the chocolate bowl on top of the hot water bowl, and make the decision whether to use a fork, a barbeque skewer or just fingers.

If you need any further instructions, you probably shouldn't have started this recipe in the first place.

When I was invited to the opening night of a new Indian restaurant in Leeds it was an offer I couldn't refuse. Cilantro already boasts a thriving business in Pickering which has earned very favourable reviews so it didn't take much to convince me that. it would be worth the drive over from the Worth Valley.

Situated in the quiet suburb of Moortown, Cilantro has prime position on the main shopping boulevard adjacent to Harrogate Road, and with excellent parking it makes it an attractive option for passing trade. There also appears to be very little competition in the area and the fact that they offer a unique blend of traditional and progressive Indian cuisine can only work in their favour.

Upon arrival our party of four were warmly welcomed and apologies were made for a slight delay - word had obviously spread quickly about their opening night as it did look somewhat oversubscribed. The restaurant and waiting area is quite small, but I expect once business is open for regular custom they will be able to manage this better. Whilst we waited

for a table we enjoyed a pint of ice cold Cobra beer and from the sights and smells on offer we eagerly anticipated some fine pan Indian cuisine . Entertainment was unwittingly provided by a waiter who dropped a plate of curry down the back of some poor fellow, but this and the heady atmosphere of a packed restaurant did little to dampen the mood.

Before long, we were seated and tucking in to our delicate starter. Three of us opted for the mixed platter of chicken chilli tikka, prawn khalonji and spiced onion fritters. It was very tasty, a subtle mix of complimentary textures and flavours without being too overbearing. My wife had the veg platter of cumin & potato cakes, spiced onion fritter and stuffed pastry triangles which she was very impressed with.

For the main course I opted for the spookily titled Shalgum Ghost, described as a.

Kashmirian winter special lamb dish cooked with turnips.shallots and red chilli. I could see why this creamy dish was called a "winter special" - on a cold January evening it was the kind of food to warm the belly, but it also had a very distinctive flavour and the generous chunks of lamb must have been slow cooked as they practically melted in the mouth. I have to find the recipe for this! To mop it all up we had slices of nan bread and peas paluao - a mixed veg rice. It complimented the Chilean merlot we ordered superbly and we were all unanimous in our appreciation of it.

The friendly manager was keen to hear our comments and he must have been relieved that despite a few hiccups the opening night of Cilantro had left a very good impression.
