Green Spring Clean

If you're planning a bout of seasonal cleaning, choosing environmentally friendly products is just one way to help make it less painful on the planet. To make your clean as green as possible some cleaning products can even be dispensed with altogether in favour of more traditional alternatives.

Spring is also an ideal time to tackle household maintenance that has been left undone over the winter months. Here's how to help get your home in harmony with the environment for the coming year.

Make repairing dripping taps a priority - they could be wasting many litres of water a day.

Replace old light bulbs with energy efficient versions and batteries with rechargeable ones.

After touching up your paintwork donate any leftovers to community projects – the UK wastes 6.2 million litres of paint every year – and avoid putting oil, paint, varnish or solvent down the drain.

Only use washing machines (or dishwashers) when they are full and try to dry your clothes on a clothesline rather than in a tumble dryer. Avoid washing clothes at 50 degrees – no garment needs to be washed at that temperature – and turn the iron off when you have only one thing left to iron.

What did granny use before heavy-duty household chemicals were invented?

Vinegar! It's useful for all sorts...

Clogged Showerhead – dismantle the showerhead, soak the pieces in white vinegar for two to three hours. Clean off any sediment with a stiff brush.

Drain Cleaner - Mix 200ml [8 fl oz] of vinegar with 75g [3 oz] of baking soda. Pour directly into the drain and leave for 10 minutes. Pour clean hot water down the drain to clear grease and debris.

Kettle descaler – cover the element with equal quantities of water and vinegar. Bring to the boil and leave to soak overnight. Brush off the sediment and wash thoroughly.

Baking Soda! Beyond baking...

Scouring Pans – mix with water into a paste and scrub stainless steel, iron and cooper pots.

Fridge Smells – put an open box of baking soda in the fridge to absorb odours.

Nappies - keeps nappy buckets fresh.

Bins – a cheap alternative to freshen up a smelly bin.

Carpets – to get rid of smells, sprinkle on the carpet and leave overnight. Vacuum up the next day.



Caster treats for sticky little fingers!





Its lovely to get the smallest of children involved in cooking - and even the youngest can make these cute little pastel coloured nests with sweet chocolate eggs nestling inside.

Then they can decorate with sprinkles and sweeties and give their very own handmade Easter gifts to the special people in their lives.

For 4 nests you will need:

2 shredded wheats (or about 20 mini wheats)
150 – 200g white chocolate
a teaspoon of oil
food colourings (I used pink, yellow and green)

a few dried apricots (or rasins)
a few flaked almonds (optional)
mini-eggs and sprinkles
several bowls
3 cocktail sticks or barbeque skewers
greaseproof paper, or greased tinfoil spread on a
flat tray

Bash up the shredded wheat in a bowl so it separates into strands.

Cut the apricots up into little pieces – children's scissors are good for this

Break up the chocolate and put in a bowl with the oil and microwave on half-power, stirring after every 30 seconds until nearly all melted. Then take out of the microwave and stir until the last bits melt.

Put a tablespoon of the melted chocolate into a small bowl (a cereal bowl is ideal) . Dip the cocktail stick into the food colouring and then stir into the chocolate – repeat until it turns into colour your child is happy with.

Then take a handful of the shredded wheat and a few apricot pieces and almonds and stir well into the coloured chocolate.

Take out with little hands and make into

a rough flattish ball on the greaseproof paper, and push a dip in the centre to make a nest shape.

While the chocolate is still soft, add a few sprinkles and put 3 little eggs in the nest, and leave to set,

Then repeat with different colours until all the mixture is used up and you have a fine selection of nests any child would be proud to give [or just eat!].



A partnership has now been established between CNHS and MySmallHelp (www.mysmallhelp.org a UK charity) to provide emergency relief – food,



clothing and shelter, with longer term plans for the rebuilding programme under development.

INSURANCE MATTERS

THE GREAT ESCAPE (There is nothing Great about an Escape of Water!)

Water escaping in the home can lead to heartbreaking damage to your possessions plus considerable cost and disruption whether you are insured or not. In fact, damage by water leaking inside a home is one of the biggest reasons people claim on their house insurance - especially around this time of year - yet most leaks are avoidable. British weather isn't that predictable so a mild spell can lull us in to a false sense of security - a cold snap can come along without warning and at any time.

Leaving your home unattended?

Turn the main stopcock off but keep your heating system on as though your home is occupied, just turn down the thermostat to around 15 degrees c. This will ensure that in the event of freezing conditions the heating will come on low and stop the water trapped in your pipes from freezing and bursting the pipes which could cause a major flood when the temperature rises again.

If your are going to be away for an extended period you might want toconsider draining down your plumbing and heating system, but do so with professional advice.

Make sure pipes and the loft, if you have one, are insulated. This will help stop pipes freezing and bursting and will help prevent joints from leaking.

Have someone keep an eye on your home and look out for leaks. Let them know where the stopcock is in case they have to turn off the mains water supply in a hurry.

What to keep an eve out for all year round.

Inspect plumbing joints from time to time. If you have copper pipes and you see a build up of green colouring on joints it might be a tell tale sign of a leak. Also check plumbing joints, which are hidden from view such as on washing machines and dishwashers.

If you have plastic plumbing joints then remember that they will probably degrade sooner than metal ones, so keep an eye out for even the slightest hint of water.

Insulate header and water tanks and check ball valves for signs of wear.

Insulate your loft to protect pipes and in severe cold weather open the loft hatch to warm the void.

Do not insulate under the water tank. this allows heat from the house to help keep the tank from freezing.

Make sure you know where the stopcock is so you can turn off the mains water where it enters the building. Test it every so often so it won't be too stiff to turn when you need to turn it off in an emeraency.

KEIGHLEY & WORTH VALLEY RAILWAY PAYS TRIBUTE TO LIONEL JEFFRIES

One of the great British character actors and film directors of the last century, Lionel Jeffries, who adapted E. Nesbit's novel The Railway Children and directed its filming on the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway, has died at the age of 84.

Chairman of the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway Preservation Society, Paul Brown, paid tribute to him, saying, "There have been many richly deserved tributes to Lionel Jeffries from the world of stage and screen, but we must remember that it was his work with our Railway 40 years ago that made our success possible. Lionel's work was instrumental in turning the five mile long branch line through Bronte' Country into an internationally acclaimed success and showed communities and groups throughout the British Isles that if they wanted to re-open and run their local railway - then they could do so. "Thanks to the huge number of extra passengers the film brought to the

Keighley & Worth Valley Railway numbers trebled - we had to install an extra track (a passing loop at Damems Junction) to cope with them. The interest today is if anything, more intense than ever. Paul added: "We are now planning the celebrations to mark the filming of The Railway Children over the forthcoming May Day Bank Holiday and we will take time to remember Lionel Jeffries and all that he and his cast. of Jenny Agutter, Bernard Cribbins, Dinah Sheridan, Sally Thomsett and the others did for the future of the Keighley and Worth Valley Railway. Thanks to Lionel, people throughout the world come to ride on our steam trains to see Oakworth station where 'Mr Perks the Porter' befriended the children while their father was wrongly imprisoned and where after many adventures, including saving the train from a landslide outside Mytholmes Tunnel between Oakworth and Haworth, they were so memorably reunited with him".

The Railway's spokesman, Jim Shipley, an acknowledged expert on the film whose book "The Making of The Railway Children" is to published by the Railway on 28th March, said: "We have stayed in touch with many of those connected with the film in the 40 years since it was made here and everyone connected with the Railway is deeply saddened by Lionel Jeffries' death." Lionel Jeffries was born on 10 June 1926 in London, served in the Army in Burma during World War II. trained at RADA and in addition to his work as an accomplished character actor, made more than 70 films ranging from Alfred Hitchcock's Stage Fright to The Railway Children.

RURAL MATTERS by Rachael Moore

With Spring around the corner, what better opportunity to lay your own eggs? Well of course – not literally!

With the help of my not so little brother, here's how. Keeping hens is a bit like baking a cake – miss out an ingredient and it will be a flop!


1.Select a suitable **chicken coop**. This needs to be weatherproof, but with plenty of ventilation, spacious and fox-proof. This could be an old garden shed, a chicken run, or you could make your own. You'll also need to fence them an enclosure so they can't escape onto roads, or into the flower beds.

2.Get the equipment and feed.
This can be bought from a local agricultural supplier such as Whitaker's Animal Feeds, or Haworth Pet Supplies is one to try. You'll need: water drinker, feed tray, vermin proof grain bin and a bag of layer's pellets. A bag of pellets costs around £10 and will last 5 hens about a month (by my brother's reckoning).

3.Get the **livestock**. Local livestock auctions do a quarterly feather sale, where you can purchase all breeds, sizes and colours of hens. I'd recommend you start with a bantam that's relatively easy to look after – a Light Sussex. Identified by their white plumage with black tipped feathers. These are generally good layers and

make good pets. They cost around £10-15 each depending on the sale. Four female hens will be a nice group size.

4.Introduce your hens to their new home. They will need a constant supply of fresh water, a perch to roost on and



names for them all. My hens used to know it was bedtime as I whistled and they came running!!

5. Cockerels. The male of the species, and just like humans, the noisiest! In all seriousness, consider carefully before you

buy a male as the WILL cock-a-doodle-do at the break of dawn – so consider your

neighbours! The whole idea of having a cockerel is that he 'treads' the hens and fertilises the eggs. If the hen sits on them for 21 days and keeps them warm, you'll get chicks.

If you don't want to breed them, just collect the eggs daily. A cockerel is not necessary for egg production, only for breeding.

Have fun and enjoy keeping poultry.




