#### What is Home-Start?

Home-Start is a national voluntary organisation offering informal, friendly support to parents with at least one child under the age of five.

Being a parent, wherever you live, whatever your circumstances, isn't always easy. Add in pressures such as illness or financial worries, and without the support of family and friends nearby, the stress can seem overwhelming.

Home-Start offers free support, friendship and practical help to families with at least one child under five. Families are visited regularly in their own homes by volunteers who have all had experience of parenting and know how hard it can sometimes be. Home-Start Craven seeks volunteers to support local families in South Craven

#### Could YOU help us make a difference for families?

YOU could have the skills needed to make a difference to a family living locally. As a parent you'll know just exactly how tough it can sometimes be. Did you often long to have someone to confide in or just have a chat with?

Home-Start's families come in all shapes and sizes and from all different backgrounds. Some may be feeling isolated, they may be new to the area without the support of family and friends, or they may be parenting alone. Others may be struggling with difficult relationships, have an illness or a disability, or have several pre-school children. All have one thing in common, the need for someone to listen and be there just for them.

Home-Start volunteers also come in all shapes and sizes and from all different backgrounds. We need people with a whole host of different experiences to provide our special kind of support to families.

### Will I be the right sort of person to support a family?

Home-Start volunteers are all ages and from all walks of life. All we ask of you is that you have experience of bringing up children and can spare a few hours a week. Initially we ask you to complete a 'Volunteer preparation course' these courses are run regularly and are free. The course usually takes place one day per week for around 10 weeks. Both day time and evening courses may be available.

Volunteers will all have to agree to undergo a full enhanced CRB check and provide 2 references. Home-Start values its volunteers highly and provides full support and training and all out of pocket expenses are reimbursed

If you or anyone else you know, think you can spare a few hours a week to become a friend to someone in their own home in the South Craven area, we would love to hear from you.



We Support Local Trade



he call came through one afternoon towards the end of September, 2007. The voice on the end of the line was almost hysterical: "Please come, we are being frightened by something on the stairs..." The voice belonged to the manageress of a fashion shop in Sheep Street, Skipton. 'Ah, yes,' I thought, 'the most haunted street in Yorkshire.'

I took the details and promised to drop in later in the afternoon. Meanwhile I took out a large folder marked 'Sheep Street' and began to wade through my casework concerning that particular street.

Late afternoon I arrived at the shop to be met by a clearly stressed manageress, surrounded by three shop girls – one of whom had been crying. The young girl, I figured about 18, stammered out her story: "I was on the stairs making coffee (there is a small

kitchen area half way up) when the hairs on my neck suddenly stood up. Something brushed against me and a voice whispered right into my ear – 'Let me out'." The manageress took up the story: "We often feel a presence on the steps, and we feel something bad has happened there, but this is the first time it has communicated with us – we are scared stiff!"

After having reassured the young girl that all would be well. I asked to see the steps and the upper floor they led to. I then explained I would need to be left alone for at least an hour whilst my psychic senses tried to make sense of the situation. The upper floor was dark and forlorn; used only for storing boxes. The windows were dirty, letting in hardly any light; some had been bricked up adding to the sense of overbearing gloom, but I could sense nothing untoward there. The stairs, however, were another matter. The moment I stood in the kitchen area I felt the atmosphere change. There is a window that looks out on Sheep Street and I suddenly felt a strong urge to open this. But I could not, however hard I tried, since the sash was heavily nailed down. From this action. I suddenly sensed a female presence stood by my side, incredibly sad and deeply oppressed. I looked up at the thick wooden beam above the stairs and new this much: a woman had killed herself here many years ago, but had trapped her spirit in doing so - now her spirit wanted to leave.

I gathered the girls together and explained the situation: from now on they must light the stairs better; sometimes with candles. They should deck the kitchen area with fresh flowers and scents – above all, they should not be scared of their

otherworldly occupant; in fact they should embrace her, even talk to her. If they did this. I promised them I would soon be able to return to release the lady. When I did return, some weeks later, I found a happy bunch of young ladies; a shop full of happiness, and a flight of stairs bright and breezy - just as it should be. "We did everything you asked," said the manageress, "and more. I took some time to look into the building's history and discovered that in the 1800s a jealous husband had kept his wife a prisoner on the upper floor. One day she escaped but could not get beyond the stairs. She found a rope, tied it to the beam above, and hanged herself. Her name was Valerie. We told her you would return, and she has been waiting for you to release her." "We will all release her." I answered. With that I said aloud: "It is time for you to leave. The doors are all open. No one will stop vou. Valerie."

It must have been a year later when I had occasion to visit the shop. By then it had changed hands and a new team of mature ladies were running it. Their eyes sparkled as I entered: "Ah. we've been waiting for vou. Mr. Hanson. When we moved in we were told the story of Valerie, so we continued to light the stairs. It seems she had not moved when you asked her to - in fact she grew very much to like the place. The young girls gave her a feeling of belonging. But when they left, soon after so did she. We know this because in our second week here, the door between the shop and the stairs opened by itself, and we heard footsteps walk by us. At the front door they halted, the door then opened of its own accord, and after some seconds, quietly closed. Valerie went that day - and





has not returned."

The adjacent story is true, and comes from the files of Malcolm Hanson, Skipton and Keighley's ghost hunter and ghost walker. On Halloween, Malcolm will be conducting his annual Skipton Ghost Night, when he takes people to the sites of his most famous cases, including Sheep Street and Skipton Castle. Why not join him?

The Great Yorkshire Show has become a

fashion event for livestock producers to showcase their cattle and sheep. Despite the glamour and high status, members of Worth Valley YFC participated in a very traditional competition stockjudging.

Wearing very trendy white coats, members competed against other Young Farmers from the rest of the County. The seven members won various individual prizes, but most importantly, the overall points trophy from the days competition - the FABBL rosebowl. This is a fantastic achievement for the club, having a population of members who primarily come from urban backgrounds. "You don't have to be a farmer, to be a Young Farmer" rings loud and clear.

Stockjudging was one of the first ever competitions of a Young Farmers Club following on from showing livestock. It is a skill that will provide future life skills. Having placed the four lambs / beef in the order of merit, giving a two minute reasoning speech to the master judge can be quite daunting.

Ellis Snowden, one of the clubs keen youngsters has had a great judging season, competing at Calderdale Show, Otley Show, YFC County Show to name a few, has really brought the prizes (and prize money!) home. Ellis has gained confidence and not only has the ability to compete at stock judging, but win!

"Coming in the top three placings at the Yorkshire Show is an honour and an achievement, let alone, winning the overall trophy", says Jennifer Moore, winning the

Keighlev Agricultural Show, in contrast has diversified into alternative avenues. to offer more attractions for the public to see, now having a strong equine community. Saying that, the 2010 show had a noticeable increase in farm stock being shown across all classes. Although stewarded by YFC members the stock classes have lacked YFC members. competing in previous years. This year over 12 members showed livestock and competed for the trophies. Ellis Snowden and Nathan Greenwood jointly won the YFC Cattle showing trophy. Jennifer and Michael Moore, won the YFC Sheep showing trophy.



• 2 medium potatoes

or 4 carrots, peeled and chopped quite small

- 750g (1½ lbs) squash (acorn, butternut or any other you can find), peeled, seeded and diced (the easiest way is to chop it in half, stand on the cut end and slice down the side to remove the skin, then just scrape out the seeds)
- zest of half an orange
- juice of 2 large oranges
- a teaspoon of freshly chopped fresh root ginger
- 750ml chicken or vegetable stock ( from cubes is fine)
- pinch around cinnamon
- 125ml double cream
- salt and freshly ground pepper

Autumn is most definitely here again, and I make no apologies for bringing out a spiced up versions favourite recipe which sees me through the autumn and winter months.

You can use any squash, gourd or other strangely coloured and shaped vegetable

you pick up from the farm shop - or pile in some sweet potatoes or carrots.

While the orange and ginger are optional, they certainly add a warming zing which is perfect after an morning of kicking up the leaves and tramping over the fields

- 1. In a large pot which has a lid, melt the butter and gently simmer the onions for about 1 minute.
- 2. Add the vegetables, orange juice and zest, stock, and ginger and bring to the boil.
- 3. Reduce the heat, put on the lid and simmer for about 30 minutes, (until vegetables are soft.
- 4. Either blend in a foodprocessor or use a hand blender until smooth
- 5. Return to the pan and slowly bring back to a gentle boil. Turn off the heat and stir in the cream and season.

This soup will keep really well for a few days, and the flavour comes through even better on day two.

#### TOP TECH TIPS with Michelle Thompson of Cloudfree IT

What is a strong password? And why do I need one?

(Or 'What's wrong with using my dog's name for everything?')

The number of user names and passwords we need to remember is growing fast...What a hassle! I've visited places where colleagues know each other's passwords and they've never changed. If you have yours on a little sticky note next to the computer, at home or work, it's there for anyone to see. If you've got to the point where you have a list written somewhere or have one password for everything, you may be laying yourself (or your employer) wide open to identity/data theft or even fraud. Would you tell every Tom, Dick or Harry your Bank PIN? Would you walk up to a stranger, hand them your house key and tell them to go help themselves to your family silver? Would you have just one master key to open all your doors, car and bank safety deposit box? No! No! No! Remember - 1. Passwords are the technological equivalent of keys to locked doors & 2. Criminals are inherently lazy. That's why they don't go out and get a proper job. If your passwords are 'strong', by that I mean complicated to work out, criminals will probably leave you and your bank account alone.

Some systems will force you to have a complex ('strong') password. This is a good thing - like your insurer insisting you have a 5-lever mortise deadlock instead of a cheap night-latch. If a

system doesn't have any password strength criteria set, do ask yourself if it's worth the risk in giving it your personal information.

It'll be a while before we find fingerprint readers and retina scanners on everything from computers and cars to the fridge door (to stop the teenage midnight snackers in their tracks), so let's not make it easy for criminals in the meantime.

Look at the following guidelines and then review ALL your passwords.

- \* Minimum of 8 characters 10 or more is better and 15 characters. would probably keep cracking software busy for long enough to put a criminal off, unless you're massively rich and the delay would be worth it.
- \* Includes upper & lowercase letters and numbers
- \* Includes special characters [e.g.,?.&^%\$£"!]
- \* It's changed often (but not just by adding a digit!)
- \* NOT the name of anyone you know (e.g. you, a loved one, family member, pet or maiden name)
- \* NOT an obvious word or phrase (password cracking software uses a dictionary to look for letter combinations).

If you're thinking 'what the heck can I have?' try using a password formula to create your passwords and then remember the formula, rather than lots of passwords. Try googling 'password formula' for some suggestions.


