KEIGHLEY & DISTRICT MODEL ENGINEERING SOCIETY



Keighley & District Model Engineering Society was formed in 1950 by a few local people who had an interest in all types of models. They came from various walks of life; civil servant, doctor, chemist. Our lifelong president is one of the founders and still meets with us even though he is in his nineties.

The first task was the construction of a miniature railway track at Greengate Road, but in 1967 we were asked to leave the site and the Council offered land at Marley where the railway is today. A problem with this site is that there are no mains services, so a very green approach was taken. Rain water for the steam locomotives is collected from the roofs; electricity is generated by a 6hp Diesel Lister built in 1948 that came from a farm in the Dales and the clubhouse is a recycled former chapel from Silsden that cost the sum of £2.50. The real steam and electric locomotives are powerful enough to haul passengers and the railway opens in the summer for the public to have rides.

The membership owns all types of model boats. In 1974 the Society hosted the World Model Power Boat Championships on Keighley Tarn. One popular type of boat is the model racing yacht and these are sailed on Weecher Reservoir at High Eldwick.

In previous years members have been award winners at London Model Engineering Exhibitions held at Alexandra Palace, Wembley and Earls Court. Each

year the Society has a display at the Northern Models Exhibition at Harrogate

> Showground. Here we have a good variety of exhibits made by members; boats, locomotives, traction engines, clocks, hot air engines and workshop equipment. Information about train rides for the public can be found on our website KDMES.org.uk

COUNTRY COOKING & FORAGING FOR FOOD For the promotion of Health & Wellbeing by Cath Bromwich



Bilberries are this month's foraging wonder. They have many regional names across the British Isles including 'fraughan' and 'blaeberry'. They are virtually the same as the blueberries in shops, though somewhat smaller and cost significantly less when provided directly from mother nature. Obviously, I believe wild bilberries taste better too.

I have fond memories of picking bilberries standing thigh deep in the beck near my Dad's childhood home. My Dad and I got about 3lbs of succulent blue-black berries that no sheep or bird had been able to gobble. We gorged on bilberry crumble that night. The problem with bilberries is that everyone loves them. Birds leave their blue poo everywhere to prove this; sheep eat the whole bush. Some people use a sort of hoover to strip a hillside. However there are few more joyful experiences than showing kids that going for a walk need no longer be a bore when you can roam from bilberry patch to patch, cramming juicy morsel's into your mouth and sticking out a blue tongue to prove what you have been up to. Bilberries truly are a joyful celebration of the beginning of the fruit season and they are very good for you as well.

The bushes mainly grow on damp moorland and in some woods. They are small bushes (approximately 2 ft. high) unless they manage to avoid being eaten. They have small darkish green oval leaves not much more than 1cm long and have tiny purple berries until they ripen into the darker delights we are talking about. Do take care not to pick them in a popular dog walking area.

'If it ain't bust don't fix it' crumble is the best thing to do with bilberries, however adding them to the Scottish Cranachen is great and just eating them squished up with cream works well. This month's recipe is a little different. It is a sort of no cook tiramisu/cheesecake with bilberries. I hope you like it.

Techno-Summer

Summer's here, and the long school break is coming anyway even if the warm weather comes to an end prematurely...

My teens keep themselves occupied most of the holidays nowadays, so I try in vain to encourage (nag) them to not waste their time playing on their laptop/games console/smartphone. I'd rather they played footie on the field, got out and about

on their bikes, or took that opportunity to earn some extra cash mowing the lawn or weeding, while I'm out at work. Seemingly they'd much rather be operating three aadaets simultaneously whilst rooted to the sofa. Grrr!

Perhaps they might sew extra battery packs into the front pocket of their hoodie or solar panels on the brim of their baseball cap, so they feel comfortable leaving the house for the whole day.

Who are we, 'the grown-ups', to lecture our offspring, though? Don't we, too, subconsciously fear being 'technically detached'? Many adults now rely on a daily dose of news, tweets, facebook posts and email.
