



I hope to do the same with this new column for this community magazine. Each month I'll go 'Inside' a location in and around Keighley and the Worth & Aire valleys and write about what I find. The idea is to give you a flavour for what happens inside various places, some of which you can visit.

Keighley & Worth Valley Railway



It's just a couple of weeks before the Railway's Annual General Meeting (the AGM) on October 7th which provides an opportunity to reflect on what we have achieved during the year and to share future plans with the Railway's membership. We will be able to remind ourselves of the visit of the iconic Flying Scotsman during the year, which took a mammoth effort to arrange and to staff during the packed visit, whilst continuing with our usual programme of popular events that appeal to a wide range of passengers. There have been challenges during the year that are a stark reminder of the cost of operating the Railway, having invested nearly £250k on improvements to the facilities at Haworth locomotive yard to help protect our historic fleet and equipment from the elements, and to do what we can to help safeguard the location from any further flood damage.

We are very mindful of the impact of the weather on the increasingly elderly infrastructure, so have taken the unusual step of devoting a full fortnight to our'Civil Maintenance' volunteers' work, and ran

kwvr.co.uk

a vintage 'bus service between Haworth and Ingrow for one weekend, because the line was lifted near Oakworth to allow us to continue our programme of waterproofing the deck of the bridges at Mytholmes. It is an expensive and time-consuming task, but it is an example of the steps we take to secure the long-teem future of the Railway, which is particularly important to us as we near our 50th Anniversary year of operations.

Whilst we are looking forward to the celebrations in 2018 to mark the reopening of the line by the Preservation Society back in 1968, we have plenty going on during the rest of 2017. We have our ever-popular Beer & Music Festival 19-22nd October. at which you can sample from a selection of over 150 real ales, which are now in the beer listing, complete with tasting notes, that can be downloaded from the events page on the website. We also have a selection of wines and ciders. and - for the first time - a range of artisan gins. It's also getting nearer Christmas, and tickets for Santa's Specials are selling fast so please do book soon to avoid disappointment. The Santa Specials start on 25 November and run each weekend from then until December 24th. but tickets for Christmas Eve have already all but sold out.

To stage this range of events, as well as to continue to run steam trains every weekend throughout the year, takes a huge volunteer effort, and I would encourage you to consider joining the team. Full training is provided for operational and maintenance roles, and there is also a very wide range of behind-thescenes tasks required to run a charity of our scale, so please do get in touch if you would like to get involved in whatever role. You will be joining a group that comprises over 500 volunteers that work together to keep a very important part of history alive, right on your doorstep.



Walking in the Aire

Riddlesden to Alder Carr Wood. Brunthwaite & Silsden (linear)

A walk devised by Lee Senior Walk Distance: 4.5 miles (7.24km) Maps required: OL21 Explorer (South Pennines)

We start with our back to Riddlesden Post Office (Bar Lane). Turn left up the road, until we reach the Leeds and Liverpool canal towpath ahead. Turn left on to the towpath for approximately 800 yards until we reach Leache's Swing Bridge.

Leave the canal here by going over the bridge. Bear left on to Leach Road - a flat and rough surfaced access track adjacent to the canal. Ignore the tarmac road climbing on our right after crossing the bridge. Soon we start to climb albeit briefly. As we pass two garages on our right, look out for a narrow uphill path just beyond. Take this path which leads into a copse of trees before crossing a minor road. Now follow a pleasant uphill waymarked path opposite that heads behind some houses. We climb some wooden steps near the houses. Our path emerges at a single track road (Western Avenue).

Turn left here for a few paces passing a small Yorkshire Water pumping station. Our path is signed to the right almost immediately beyond it. Climb several steps and ascend gradually until we go through a gate. A yellow waymarker points our way. Now we climb guite steeply up the right edge of the sloping field. The path stays close to the wall, reaching a gate at the top. Go through the gate and turn left on a steadily ascending tarmac track to Low Wood Head. It is worth pausing here to catch our breath while taking an admiring look back at the wider Aire Valley and Keighley. Stay on the main track going over a shallow speed bump. Avoid any other routes as we progress to reach the residential



buildings. Here we take the most obvious route in-between the buildings. A green footpath sign to our right points our way through a wooden gate on the left. We are now on a concrete drive for just a few paces. A waymarked path is on our right, immediately beyond an outbuilding, opposite a coniferous hedge. Head down this short enclosed path to a wall stile. Go up several steps and through the stile. An arrow points half right across a field. Take this path which goes diagonally upwards to a small gate in the field corner. Go through the gate and proceed forward, briefly crossing a tarmac driveway. Now climb some grassy steps in front of us, emerging on to a good-surfaced lane, close to High Wood Head.

We follow the direction of a finger post pointing left (to Silsden). The hard-standing surface makes for pleasant walking with commanding views. Proceed on this level route until a sharp left bend in the track. At this point we keep our existing line. Proceed ahead on a grassy track to go through a large farm gate. Continue in a straight direction initially. We then bear half left, losing some height as we go, to reach a gate. Go through the gate and note the yellow arrow tempting us forward into a copse of trees.

We now stick to the perimeter of the currently closed golf club on our meandering but obvious path. Take care here as there are tree roots and rocks to negotiate in places.

SILSDEN Kirkoate (End) Brunthwaite

We cross a stream before climbing a ladder stile in the wall ahead. Continue forward on the edge of a gently sloping field. Our path keeps close to a wall on our right until we almost reach a pylon Before the pylon, bear left diagonally losing height down the field as we go. There is no exact path at this point. However a post and a large gate are quickly located below us. Make a beeline for the gate and go through it (with fading arrow marker). Proceed on a clear green path that descends to a wall stile. Climb this to head into Alder Carr Wood two miles into our walk.

PULL OUT AND

I SAV

Follow the immediately obvious descending short path in the wood until it merges with a level wide track. Don't carry on descending here. Instead turn right briefly, on the wide track which retains its height. We guickly reach a fork. Head right here for several pacesonly. Now head immediately left down a narrow path. The wider path we have left now heads away, slightly higher to our right.

Our chosen (narrow) path takes us delightfully into the heart of this very pleasant deciduous wood. Descend briefly before bearing half right and levelling. The path becomes wider for a while before narrowing again as we head underneath some overhead electric cables. Continue and we soon pass under a second set of overhead cables. The tree cover gradually whield becomes less dense.

Shortly we reach a fork in the path ahead. Turn left here on the clearly descending path. A faint yellow arrow is sprayed on a tree on the right,

showing our route. Stay on the descending path to merge with another level path coming in from our left near a wall. Continue ahead following this level path through a gate, with the wall on our left into a field. Keep a similar line in the field, still near to the wall to emerge at another gate that takes us to the road. Turn left down the narrow road (Holden Lane).

Take care along this descending, twisting road as we walk for several minutes without deviating from it. Keep a look out for a farm on our left just before a small road bridge (Holden Bridge).

Immediately after crossing the bridge a green footpath sign is noticed to our right. Take this route, leaving the road here. Walk just a few paces to reach a gate. We are now on the Millennium Way (MW) walk, confirmed by a waymarker. After going through the gate, initially there is no obvious route. However looking ahead, two telegraph poles can be seen on the cont...

...sloping field. Ascend towards the first pole where a further MW marker confirms we are on our route.

Head towards the second telegraph pole, but do not walk right up to it. Instead as we get nearer to it, look half-left towards the stone wall on the left boundary edge of the field. A stile is visible in the wall corner. Head directly towards the stile. Don't carry on to the second pole. We cross the stile in the corner, where another MW marker guides us forward. Quickly we climb another wall stile a short distance away. Continue along the short enclosed path towards two stone pillars. There are two routes here; our route follows the yellow waymarker straight ahead, as we ignore the MW arrow pointing right.

Proceed along the surfaced route with the golf course on our right until the track bears left. Our next route- an initially obscure footpath is located here, in between two large holly bushes. We are heading on to a right of way across Silsden golf course. The right of way across the course is marked by a series of easy to follow green and white posts. The first post comes into view ahead of us. Keep a keen lookout for the next post ahead of you at all times and of course for any low flying golf balls. We head directly across the course with the purpose of making our way to the course car park adjacent to the clubhouse. The marker posts run in a generally almost straight line. Our route takes us close to the tee of the fourth Hole. Eventually a well-used path -by golfers and walkers alike, takes us to a point where we can see the car park and clubhouse below. Make a beeline for the car park and go down some guite steep steps to reach it. These steps are easy to miss at first glance as they can be obscured by vegetation. In the car park, carefully walk through the parking bays, but not in the direction of the clubhouse. A green footpath sign eventually shows our way out of the car park, via a ladder stile over the wall ahead- to the right of the car park exit. We find ourselves on a minor road (Brunthwaite Lane) at

High Brunthwaite.

Turn left along the road until the junction ahead. Just before the road end, don't be tempted to take the left hand filter road. Instead we turn right on to another road (Hawber Lane) signposted Ilkley. Walk for barely a couple of minutes on this road until we reach Drabble House Farm on the left. A green footpath sign shows the way, into the farmyard and then through the red gate. Keep close to the farm buildings on our left as we take a short path, leading to a further gate. Don't take the right hand path here. Instead go through the gate on to a now grassy and easy to follow path ahead. A row of houses is to our left. Go through the next gate ahead, having ignored the alternative gate in the wall to our left. We are now in the residential streets of Silsden. Continue ahead to reach the road junction. Turn left here, and then take a guick right, into Craven Drive. As we descend a green footpath sign is visible on the right as the road bears left. Take this tarmac path, which straddles houses to reach a fork. Silsden Recreation Ground is noticed. Turn left for just a few paces, before we bear right. Follow this enclosed tarmac track as it widens. Soon the busy traffic of Kirkgate is noticed ahead. However, first we find ourselves at a delightful duck pond and Silsden Beck. This is a pleasant place to spend a few minutes. Turn right at the water to cross a stone bridge over the Beck leading into Kirkgate and the end of our walk.

Haworth, the world's first Fairtrade Village, was the chosen destination for a Fairtrade fact-finding visit by Megumi Morita from Japan. She is from Zushi, Japan's third Fairtrade town, which lies on the coast, south west of Tokyo.

After attending the recent International Fair Trade Towns conference in Saarbrucken with Bruce Crowther MBE, founder of the global Fairtrade Town initiative and Director of The FIG Tree, Megumi came to the UK to discover more about collaborative Fairtrade initiatives in this country.

Haworth Fairtrade Group members organised an informative itinerary, which included visiting West Lane Baptist Church, the Bronte Parsonage, Sonia's Smile Fair Trade shop and the KWVR station in Haworth.
