

David Welch, local Haworth artist, and specialist in pet portraiture, has recently donated his work to the Haworth Cat Rescue charity with a promise to donate a percentage of further commissions to support their ambitious plans for a new centre in the Airevalley.

An animal lover and pet owner himself, David returned to his art a few years ago and found himself naturally attracted to illustrating animals.

"I have been drawing since I was very young." David explained. "And I went to art school and became professionally trained." But David's work in the commercial field of advertising and signmaking eventually took him further away from his creative talents and in to unrelated employment.

"I'm delighted to be back doing what I do best." David now works from his home in Haworth and is enjoying a variety of portrait work; (He is equally competent with humans, and enjoys capturing landscapes, or sketching client's homes and takes commisions for work in most mediums, including pastels, coloured pencils, watercolours, or oils. "I usually work from photographs, either taken by the client or myself. It is best to capture the subject in its natural environment." People are surprised to hear that it doesn't cost the earth to commision a work of art. David can capture his subject in a simple sketch for as little as £10. It varies greatly, depending on the work involved and the medium.

The pastel portrait of the cats in the photograph (left), for example, can be commissioned for under £100. WINED AND DINED by Claire Smith



For someone whose personal happiness depends heavily upon the regular consumption of chocolate, the onset of the month which plays host to the festival of Easter holds a special kind of anticipation. There is something extraordinarily alluring about the glossy orbs of smooth creamy chocolate, Easter bunnies, chicks and lambs and tiny chocolate eggs, foil wrapped to look like golden promises or encased in speckled candy-coating, lined upon the shelves of confectioners shops. To my eternal shame, I remember pinching fragments of Easter egg shell from the children's eggs once they had been broken into (my girls will never speak to me again!). I am sure that I am not the only one to have succumbed to this particular temptation.

Chocolate has a rich history. Its effects have been well documented over the years, and though it is often looked upon with negativity (having been cast in the role of the Byronic hero of foodstuffs – mad, bad and dangerous to know, but gloriously fascinating and seductive) chocolate is actually blessed with properties which affect our bodies in a positive way. Chocolate has a blend of over five hundred flavours and odours which not only pleasure the taste buds but also

release endorphins, causing the brain to experience a natural high and lifting the spirits. It is also rich in antioxidants with some studies actually going so far as to suggest that chocolate could clear the arteries as opposed to blocking them.


The origins of this sensuous substance can be traced back three thousand years to the Olmec who had settled in the tropical forests of the Gulf of Mexico. They were the first civilisation to cultivate the cacao tree. It was the Mava who later became the originators of the beverage we now know as hot chocolate. This exotic and intoxicating liquor was thought to have magical properties, to be the food of the Gods (I hold the same sentiments) and was enjoyed by kings and noblemen. The Aztecs believed their king to be the God of the Air, whose mission on earth was to bring seeds from the cacao tree in the Garden of Eden to man, in order to instruct mortals in the cultivation of crops. In late European 'society', chocolate was drunk by the upper classes in early coffee or 'chocolate' houses.

I find chocolate one of the most beguiling of ingredients. Melted, blended or baked it is magical and pleasurable to work with; the observation of silky rivulets of molten chocolate being both bewitching and hypnotic.

Chocolate in any form adds a hedonistic tone to any dish; use it to create sumptuous desserts or to add special depth and richness to savoury dishes – chilli responds well to the addition of one or two squares of high quality dark chocolate.

Wishing you all a happy Easter, and make sure you lock up your eggs because I'm on the loose!

Wax Crayon - can be removed from most surfaces with white spirit, methylated spirit or liquid silver polish.

Leather furniture - to prevent it drying out, mix two parts raw linsed oil with one part wine vinegar. Shake well and apply evenly with a soft cloth, polish.

Use a broad clean paintbrush to dust the tops and fronts of books stacked on a shelf.

Window cleaning solution - mix 3 tbsp (45ml) white vinegar with 4pt (2.5ltr.) water. Apply with a clean cloth. Dry off with a chamois or crumpled sheet of newspaper.







CROW HILL, A hard circular walk. 7miles (11.5km)

Walk start point: Stanbury Bus terminus, Hob Hill, at the western end of Stanbury Main Street.

Walk information: An easy first 1.75miles (3km) to Top Withins Farm (ruin), deceptively hides the hard walk ahead across what is arguably the most remote and rugged moorland in the Bradford District. Due to the nature of this terrain, the walk is only suitable for fit, regular walkers. We recommend the OS South Pennines OL21 explorer map and a compass.

Starting rom Stanbury bus terminus walk up Back Lane (the narrow lane leading uphill from the bus terminus). The route to Top Withens is well sign posted. On reaching Top Withins farm, walk round to the rear of the building and take the narrow but well-defined path leading steeply uphill from the building, walking in a northwesterly direction. Follow this narrow path, which will eventually lead you to the trig point above Delph Hill (444m/ 1456ft above sea level). On reaching the trig point look across the moorland to your left, in a south westerly direction of 248 degrees, to see Alcomden Stones our next landmark. Continue from the trig point by following the narrow path through the heather to the stones, once there walk among the stones to the southern edge of the cluster. Here amongst the

heather look for the faint path, which runs from left to right at 309 degrees and forms the boundary between the Bradford and Calderdale districts. On finding the path turn right and follow the boundary walking in a northwesterly direction of 309 degrees. Continue across the moorland for 1mile (1.6km) before reaching the Lancashire boundary, here at the bottom of the incline, bear slightly to your right (323 degrees) and walk uphill to your destination, Crow Hill [458m/1503 feet above sea level]. The exact location being arbitrary as there is no indication on the ground as to where the top is.

To Return Assume the position of overlooking Water Sheddles Reservoir in the valley below and turn to your right to walk in an easterly direction of 80 degrees, along the top edge of the moorland escarpment for just over .5mile (0.8km), to the large

marked boundary stone, here we cross back into the Bradford District. From the boundary stone continue downhill in an easterly direction of 90 degrees, to enter the top end of the now disused quarry workings at Delph Hill Quarry. Here, follow the well-defined quarry track through the workings and across the moorland grasses of Ponden Slack to a

gate and a stile, which leads into a double walled farm track. Climb the stile and follow the farm track as it meanders downhill,

as it meanders downhill, passing a farmyard on the right, before eventually reaching the junction with City of Bradford Metropolitan

At the far end of the reservoir, near to the dam wall turn right off the wide surfaced road, to walk uphill following the unmade farm track for quite a distance, until you reach a gate/stile at the top end. Climb the stile to emerge onto another track at Buckley Green Bottom, turn left uphill and follow the

track straight ahead as it changes to a surfaced road. Follow the surfaced road to its junction with Back Lane, the road on which the walk began. www.countrysideaccess.gov.uk Telephone: 0845 100 3298

Can I Take My Dog?

In general, you may take your dog with you but, if there are livestock

around or it is between 1st
March and 31st
July, you must keep the dog
on a short lead, no more than
two metres long.
On some land there may

be a total ban on dogs for all or part of the year, or an extension of the period when you must keep your dog on a

lead. This may be for the purposes of land management or nature conservation. These restrictions will be shown on signs at access

points and must be observed; the alternative to restrictions on dogs may be to close land to the public altogether to protect groundnesting birds and other wildlife.







Dry Ingredients:

450g strong bread flour (plus some extra)

1 packet dried yeast (7g)

110g sugar

2 tbsp cinnamon

2 tsp nutmeg

1 tsp ground cloves

100g currants or sultanas or raisins

50g mixed peel (or chopped peel of an orange and a lemon)

All mixed together in a bowl

Wet Ingredients:

50g melted butter 250g milk

Heated together until warm

1egg plus one egg yolk
Wisked into the milk and butter

Paste for Crosses:

60g plain flour 2tbsp sugar 60ml water

Mixed together to make a paste

Glaze:

1 egg white 2 tbsp sugar Mixed together

NEL'S HOT CROSS BUNS

Spiced buns with a cross marked on them have been around for centuries - the Romans marked buns with a cross representing the 4 phases of the moon, and Ancient Greeks decorated them with a double pair of horns, representing an Ox God. They have been traditionally eaten on Good Friday since Elizabethan times, and Queen Elizabeth I passed a law stating that they should only be eaten at Easter and Christmas – perhaps our supermarkets should take note!

These are simple to make, delicious warm from the oven with butter, and a good recipe for anyone wanting to learn the basics of bread making.

1.Make a well in the middle of the dry ingredients, and pour the milk mixture into it. Stir together until it starts to form a sticky ball

2.Tip onto a flour covered work surface. Get your hands really floury, and knead the dough for about 10 minutes until it is smooth - using extra flour to help 3.Wash out your bowl, grease it with a little bit of butter or oil and put your ball of dough into it. Cover with cling film or a damp tea towel, and leave it somewhere warm (like a sunny windowsill or an airing cupboard) for about 90 minutes. It should grow to about twice its original size, Use the time to wash up and tidy the kitchen! 4.Take the dough out, knock all of the air out of it, and knead again for a minute or two

5.Make into 8 balls, and put on a floured baking tray, covered with a tea towel and put somewhere warm for another 20 minutes 6.Make up the paste for the crosses by mixing the flour with just a small amount of water so there are no lumps, and slowly adding the rest of the water, followed by the sugar. (add extra water or flour if needed)

7.Cut a half centimeter off the bottom corner of a freezer bag, and put the paste into this, twist the top of the plastic bag until it comes out of the hole (or use an icing bag if you have one). Pipe a cross onto each bun.

8.Bake at 180 C (gas mark 4) for 10 minutes, and then turn the oven down to 150C (gas mark 2) for another 15 minutes.

9.Mix the left over egg white with 3 tbsp of sugar, and paint over each bun with a pastry brush as a glaze. The heat of the buns will set this and make them shiny 10.Let them cool for a while, and then split and serve with plenty of butter.

Painting & Dec<u>o</u>rating

- After painting a door and allowing it to dry, rub the door edges with a candle to prevent the door from sticking. Or put a film of talcum powder round the door edge.
- 2. When painting windows, protect the glass from paint by placing strips of dampened newspaper along the inside edges. It is easily removed when the job is done.
- 3. To stop newly painted windows from sticking to the frame, allow the paint to dry and spray both painted edges with furniture polish and rub gently with a cloth, before closing the window.
- 4. When painting cellar steps add a little sand to the paint to give better grip on the treads.
- 5. When measuring lengths of wallpaper, use Blu-Tack to hold the top of the paper to the wall while you mark the correct length.
- 6. After wallpapering, rinse the paste brushes in salted water before washing them. This removes the paste more easily and leaves the brushes soft and springy.





TOP TECHIE TIPS

When it comes to computers, one of the commonest things people complain about is generally poor performance. The usual symptoms experienced include...computer takes a long time to start up, windows and documents take a long time to open, applications take a long time to launch, and most frequently, the computer tends to hang up.

The usual cause of this kind of set of problems can be that your computer's hard drive is what is called fragmented. The hard drive is where everything on your computer is stored. It consists of a series of ceramic platters with a magnetic coating which stores all your data. The data is stored in what are know as blocks so essentially you can think of your hard drive as being made of thousands of little compartments which hold all the information. Each block is quite small so even a small file will be stored across more than a block, and large files such as pictures or video could be stored across hundreds of them.

When your hard drive is new, information is written one block after another in sequence. However if you delete a file it leaves a gap with the existing filled blocks when you save a new file it fills in the gaps first before starting on unused areas of your hard drive. This means instead of all the information for one file all being in one contiguous area of your hard drive it could be spread out all over the place

and this is what we call *fragmentation*. If you imagine that your hard drive is like a filing cabinet and you have a single document that consists of 10 pages. If those 10 pages are all in one folder in one draw of your filing cabinet it is easy to find and read it. If each page is in a separate folder in a separate draw, then it is going to take a long time to find them all and put them together, and its exactly the same for your computer's hard drive.

Do not worry though; your computer comes with a program, which can defragment your hard drive for you. Click on the **Start** button then navigate to Programs, Accessories, System **Tools** and in there you will see **Disc Defragmenter.** Launch it and you will see options to analyze and defragment. Click analyze and you will see graphical representation of your hard drive. If there are a lot of red lines on it then this is where the cause of your poor performance probably lies. Click **Defragment** and your computer will physically copy data from one place to another on your hard drive until all the blocks for each file are next to each other, it could take a while though, if you have never defragmented or its been a while since you last did it, be prepared to wait a few hours for the job to complete. Once you have got through this first big session you should defragment every week or two to keep your hard drive working properly.


