

James or Percy? Henry or Edward? This was the conundrum I faced on a recent visit to Toymaster in Keighley, but that's about as difficult as it got when it came to deciding what to get my son Luke for his 3rd birthday. He is absolutely obsessed with trains – in

particular anything to do with Thomas the Tank Engine (He's tried Chugginton, but despite it's superior animation it doesn't have the same appeal).

If you're likely to trip over anything in our house then it's likely it will be a Thomas or a piece of his track.

The place is slowly becoming a shrine to this legendary blue choo choo. We have all kinds of toys, posters, flags and books bearing the little tank engines name. Gullane who own the publishing rights to the Thomas must be rich beyond their wildest dreams. Talking of dreams - Luke is always telling me about his dreams of driving trains and I sometimes wonder if his obsession is because of where we live. He's seen the "real" Thomas down at Ingrow station and his favourite film is the Railway Children - he must have watched it nearly a hundred times. WINED & DINED

The silken and burnished form of the ripe tomato - the result of months spent languishing

in the sweltering Mediterranean sun or against the parched walls of the hothouse - is very well suited to its nickname of "loveapple

or "pomodoro" (golden apple when in Italy). The powerful scent of the plant and the feverish flush of colour ranging from light ochre to searing crimson suggests an earthiness and promise which add to the allure of these glossy little fruits.

I can find many reasons to admire and applaud this sun-kissed culinary superstar, capable of playing anything from rising starlet to chorus-line, but one of the main reasons for cultivating a taste for the tomato has to be that they are fantastically good for you. With a high water content, but low in calories the tomato is rich in vitamins A. B and C and has diuretic and laxative properties. According to Italian oncologist Professor Umberto Veronesi, lycopene, a substance naturally occurring in these rubicund rascals protects against cancer by reducing the formation and activity of free radicals. lycopene is found in abundance in raw tomatoes, which differ from their fellow fruits whose antioxidant components are reduced by cooking, in that when cooked the quantity of lycopene yielded by the tomato is increased five-fold. The heat from the cooking process breaks down the flesh of the tomato liberating the lycopene which is then easily absorbed into the human body. This alone should be

reason enough to step up ones tomato intake but add to this the versatility of the tomato as an ingredient and it becomes quite indispensable.

Classic French, Provencal, Languedocian and Italian cookery would be unimaginable without the tomato. I love Italian food, especially pasta which can be dressed with any number of gorgeous tomatobased sauces. There is Sugo Bombolino, a lightly cooked pureé of bombolini (cherry) tomatoes, oil, salt and basil. Sugo alle melanzane, a sauce made with tomatoes, fresh aubergine, basil and garlic; Sugo ai pepperoni, which consists of tomatoes, sweet peppers, onion, olive oil, parsley and basil; Rosalina, a sauce made from cherry tomatoes and ricotta and La Rosmarina, a spicy Mediterranean sauce made from ripe tomatoes, small, fresh rosemary leaves, oil, garlic, chilli pepper and salt which is wonderful with pasta, as a topping for pizza or for flavouring roast beef, pork or chicken. Pomodori Bombolini, peeled and bottled cherry tomatoes and pomodori pelati, peeled tomatoes bottled with a little basil, adorn the shelves of my pantry and have become store cupboard staples in our house, their absence causing a slight sense of panic when we run out (these come from a wonderful Tuscan farm mentioned in a previous article - via mail order) and have to make do with tins of chopped tomatoes from the supermarket.

Closer to home, green tomatoes are used in pickles, chutneys and tomato jam, suggesting that the love affair with the love apple is truly universal.

At the time that you read this we will be less than 6 weeks away from Haworth's first Ecofair, "Fair Intents". You may have seen the adverts already and the fact that you are reading this is good news for those of us that are planning the celebratory weekend.

The goal of the weekend is to showcase a more sustainable way of living, and to highlight the fact that it is a 'better' way of living. I realise that this is a very subjective view and that I will need to back it up. But instead of using facts and figures I urge you to come along to the Bronte Parsonage meadow and see for yourself.

I believe that deep within us is a recognition that the 'disposable society' has run its course. "Here Today-Gone Tomorrow' is all very well for a daylily whose bloom lasts less than 24 hours, but not for a throwaway-razor. The daylily will compost down and become the fertiliser for other plants, but the razor will stay a good for nothing hazard in a landfill site for decades.

It dosen't have to be this way. We have seen the move away from plastic shopping bags in the last few years. We have begun to think about choosing food that hasn't come from overseas. We are conscious that the petrol we put in our cars is linked to BP and the oil spill in the Gulf...

"Fair Intents" will not change the world, and it will not even change Britain. But it will be another small link in the chain that changes our community into one that thinks rather than just consumes and celebrates rather than takes for granted.

Sharing my passion for Forest Schools

Forest Schools is a unique approach to outdoor play and learning centred around the individual. A mixture of structured and unstructured activities allow participants (child or adult) to learn and develop at their own pace resulting in each individual gaining a valuable, personal experience. Some key focus areas are around developing self awareness, self regulation, empathy, social and communication skills, independence, self-esteem and confidence. Participants visit the same woodland on a regular basis in all weathers and develop coping strategies, risk management skills, creativity and use their own initiative to solve problems and co-operate with others. My experiences of running Forest School programmes with children have been very rewarding. I enjoy the spontaneity and creativity that develops within sessions. I have seen children who are more familiar with playing computer games begin a programme cautiously, being quiet and unsure of their surroundings, become loud and confident in a variety of ways! I love watching them explore the outdoor environment and discover new ways of interacting with it, and seeing their perceptions of what can be done outdoors moving away from traditional ideas such


as playing sports. Instead, we rescue fairies, meet dragons and build homes for woodland creatures. build dens, think about survival skills, or create works of art.

I have worked with schools (during school time, with after school clubs, and with nurture groups), children's centres, community groups (including community centres, family groups, uniformed groups), playschemes, and children with behavioural difficulties. Each programme has been different and had different outcomes. A particular success story was work done with a selective mute. At school, the child would not talk and was reluctant to interact with others. When she started her Forest School journey, we used activities where children could work individually, and built on these experiences by asking children to share what they had being doing. At the beginning, she would just point to something she had done. By the end, she was working with other children and would feedback to the whole group. For me, the best part about Forest Schools is that the participants lead their own adventures, and I feel privileged to be a part of this.

Fresh and fruity ices for hot summer days

Like many good recipes, this was born from a creative accident - in this case involving a glut of summer fruit in the freezer, a temperamental smoothie maker and some empty yoghurt pots about to be put out for the recycling.

These fruit filled ice lollies are quick and simple to make, as healthy as you want them to be - and guaranteed to charm a smile from any hot sticky child (or grown up) before they leap back into the paddling pool. They make a great dessert for a summer barbeque too,

You will need.

• 200g of frozen summer berries (my favourite being raspberries, blueberries, plus an optional nectarine or two)

- 100ml greek yoghurt (or double cream if you prefer)
- 3 tablespoons of caster sugar
- some water
- 100a white chocolate
- a tablespoon of cream
- sugar sprinkles to decorate

 6-8 little containers such as child-sized voghurt pots (such as petit filous), or actimel bottles with the top inch cut away, or shot glasses

 Wooden barbeque skewers cut to about 8-10 cm. or small lollipop sticks or small plastic teaspoons to act as sticks

• An egg box (empty)

Whizz the fruit, sugar, greek yoghurt and about 100ml water together to make a delicious mush in a blender or foodprocesser - it should still be fairly thick



Spoon into the yoghurt pots and freeze for about half an hour, but no longer Push a stick / spoon/skewer about three quarters of the way into each one, and freeze again for around 2 hours.

When the lollies are well frozen, put the chocolate and the cream in a high sided narrow mug, and heat gently in the microwave until starting to melt (a few bursts of 30 seconds at half power. stirring each time usually does it) Stir well and allow to cool, but not set. Put the sprinkles into another mug

Take the lollies out of the freezer and quickly take them out of the containers yoghurt pots can be just cut away, shot alasses need to be set in some warm water for a few minutes and then eased out.

Dip quickly into the melted chocolate, (don't worry about coating the whole lolly), and then into the sprinkles. Poke holes into the top of the egg box and push the lolly stick into them and pop back in the freezer for at least 15 minutes, or until needed. These should keep in the freezer for 6-8 weeks, but I can't prove it as they always get eaten within about 6-8 minutes! by Nel, worthbaking.co.uk





FIT FOR ALL AGES by Lauren Barker

I am a self-confessed gym addict. Whenever I've had a bad day, or I'm feeling stressed out, my initial reaction is to go straight down to the gym and get my

pulse racing and my muscles aching. A strange way of dealing with my crazy teenage moods? Not at all, in fact exercise is a perfect stress buster according to science, as it stimulates the body's production of endorphins, which promote a feeling of wellbeing and just generally chill you out.

Many health benefits of regular exercise are fairly well known (reduced risk of heart disease and stroke, improved blood pressure, lower cholesterol levels), and it is definitely the best solution if you want to lose weight or tone up. If you bring your own headphones you can watch any of the channels shown on the TVs in the gym, and can listen to music or audio books if you have your own iPod or mp3 player. Workouts also run various classes, which can be a great way of exercising in a social environment where you can meet new people.

I believe it is important to get into the habit of regular exercise as soon as possible, ideally from a fairly young age, as you grow up seeing it as a fundamental and enjoyable part of life rather than a chore. Having said that, it's never too late to make exercise a part of your life, as demonstrated by my grandmother who started going to the gym last year, and now looks and feels fantastic for it!

I personally find going to the gym the most effective way of keeping my fitness levels up, and other benefits I experience include major de-stressing, clearer and more healthy skin, more energy, better muscle tone and much higher confidence. There are also tons of other ways to get your heart rate going, from running in your local area to joining a salsa dance class or going for a swim, and the sooner you make exercise a part of your life, the sooner you'll see and feel the rewards. What are you waiting for? There is no time like the present to get fit!



Records tell us that there was a brass band at Ponden, as long ago as 1854, founded by John Heaton (of Ponden) and consisting of a fine body of excellent musicians. They were later engaged to play at the celebrations in Haworth at the conclusion of the Crimean war.

At that time there were some younger Haworth men who did not belong to a band but were keen instrumentalists of sorts and, on occasions, some of them assisted the Ponden performers. One Christmas morning in the early 1860's, the muchrespected Mr Hartley Merrall, who was well known as an industrialist (based at Springhead Mill) and himself a keen musician, was on his way to Haworth Parish church when he came upon a party of local musicians busking. Mr Merrall listened intently to their music and invited them to his house that evening. He was determined to have a brass band of his own and shortly afterwards the 'Spring Head Band' was formed which was to be the forerunner of The Haworth Brass Band.

Jim Bancroft, better known as Jim O'Abes who had played with the Ponden Band, was appointed leader and William Turner of Oakworth was the first conductor. The band enjoyed immediate success and went on to win the first of many awards in Keighley, Skipton and Trawden and at Crystal Palace in 1863.

On the retirement of Mr Merrall from his business at Spring Head Mill, the future of the band became uncertain. Through the efforts of Mr J. T. Robinson (a well-known local businessman) a meeting was held at The Black Bull Inn (Haworth) and was attended by many influential gentlemen [of Haworth] to consider the ways and means by which the future of the band could be secured.

Negotiations commenced for the purchase of instruments and other essential properties and this, in addition to the provision of new uniforms, was accomplished by means of public subscription which raised the considerable sum of £200. Thus the Spring Head Band became the Haworth Band and Mr Jim Bancroft continued as their leader; a position he retained with distinction, for 40 years. Trustees were appointed and a Deed signed which stated that the band was formed with the objective of promoting the knowledge and practice of instrumental music and affording musical entertainment for the inhabitants of Haworth. An objective which remains at the heart of 'Haworth Bandsmen' to this day - 155 years later!

Since its formation the band has been conducted by some eminent musicians among them William Turner, Edward Newton, John Paley, Percy Redman, Joseph Binns, John Crossley, Percy Shaw, Handel Parker and Arthur Rodaerson.



Haworth Band with the 'celebrated' Handel Parker On Handel Parker's retirement, after 50 years of devoted service to the band, he was presented with a silver baton. Handel Parker of course achieved fame as the composer of one the greatest hymn tunes of the time, "Deep Harmony".

Our Claim to Fame in 1970

In 1970 the film 'The Railway Children' was produced, featuring a brass band made up of members of the Haworth Brass Band and the photograph below was taken during filming and features three of our current members. The film remains one of the classics of our time and a firm family favourite and, nearly forty years later, some of our 'film star' members remain with the band and speak with affection of their role in the film.
