

WORTH VALLEY WILDLIFE by The Birdman of Haworth

Hot summer night, half awake, half asleep, you finally drift off. But now the sun is up and you're awake. Your mouth is agape; you've been catching flies! You've always been a fitful sleeper.

It's a few years since you've been in Haworth, but you have fond memories from childhood; doting parents and fun and

games chasing around the local neighbourhood with your brothers and sisters. But now you've grown up and are looking for a new hang out ...you would settle in Haworth. but lets face it. not every day is summer and other more exotic climes beckon ... you'll be off again before it gets too cold. You're a global traveller, but for a few months a year you can't beat Haworth. Wow, just think of all those air-miles you could earn-you've already flown half a million miles! But, what about your carbon footprint? Well, this global traveller has no carbon footprint, in fact as the ultimate in flying machines it barely has any feet at all! Welcome to the world of the swift, the Worth Valley's most extra-ordinary



summer visitor. From the moment they leave their nests as young birds they will spend the next 2 or 3 years



in the air. They will feed on the wing, sleep on the wing and even mate on the wing only landing when they find a suitable nest site (usually in holes in roof tops – the nearest we have to caves). During its life time. a mature bird will make

the equivalent of 6 round trips to the moon! Their sleep is fitful by our standards – they switch off half their brain as they ride the thermals at night. Their feeding habits are similar to basking sharks, with mouths agape they feed on aerial plankton – flies, aphids, spiders and other very small creatures that are blown around our summer skies.

So, check them out before they leave us for Africa in mid - August. To tell them apart from their close cousins the swallow and house-martin, look for dark scythe/anchor shapes hurtling across the sky; screeching and screaming like the most boisterous children you've ever met!

There comes a time in every pet owner's life when you look down at your beloved pet and gaze in to his eyes and think... (a) you are so handsome or (b) Why are you scratching all over my beige carpets? Yes folks, it's that

The summer weather is here and the

temperatures are perfect for fleas to plague our pets. The best thing to do is to prevent them from hitching a ride whilst out and about; and the best treatment I have come across is one supplied by the vet – BEFORE the fleas hop on. I personally use a spot on solution which you put on the back of the animals neck so it cannot be licked off – best to do this at bed time. This method should prevent fleas from attaching to your pet before an outbreak but if it's all too late and you think your pal has been infested perhaps you could carry out a little test; Just bob a white piece of paper underneath your pet and rub his coat vigorously for one minute. Remove any hair from the paper and transfer the rubbings on to damp cotton wool. Leave for another minute and if the rubbings turn to red spots then it would be fair to say your pet has fleas! – Sorry.

The next stage is to plan your attack. They have invaded your pet; you don't really want them to invade your house too! A flea's life cycle lasts three weeks. The adult flea will first latch on to your animal and feed on his blood. It's then when they start to lay eggs and it's the eggs that drop off in to the house. A female flea can lay around 30-40 eggs per day. There are 2 different types of insecticides typically used; Adulticides - these kill the fleas on your pet and the other are called Insect Growth Regulators (IGR) which rid your home of the eggs dropped off in your carpets. Your local vet or pet shop will have the best products on the market to combat these intruders. Just remember to treat every cat and dog in the house - even if you have a house cat in the home. I would strongly recommend preventative measures be put in place to ensure summer goes without an itch! Contributed by Amy Borsay, Paws 4 a Walk

The twinning agreement between Haworth and Machu Picchu has now

been signed in both hemispheres of the world, in English and in Spanish, and at the signing in Peru, particular reference was made to the way it reflects Incan culture. The project began four years ago, after a visit to schools in Machu Picchu, and discussions with the local community who expressed an interest in forming a close friendship. The people of Machu Picchu were amazed that anyone showed interest in their community, being used to droves of tourists who don't give them a second thought as they pass through the village. Haworth may not be one of the Seven Wonders of the World but we can



understand that experience. The agreement was developed and signed here and then sent to Machu Picchu, where it was discussed at the full Council and the wording and

principles endorsed. The document was countersigned on May 28th 2009. As well as a copy of the DVD being sent out, children in Haworth Primary School put in a huge effort to write letters of

introduction in Spanish. Their peers in Machu Picchu easily understood

the letters which is a great testament to our children's linguistic prowess. The enthusiastic replies were shared with Haworth children at school.

What does it mean?

Twinning is on the up – communication is changing, and the world's economies are becoming interdependent, and twinning is an important part of understanding other cultures. It is a privilege to be associated with such an amazing place; both communities will be able to learn a great deal from each other.

Next steps

We are working with Bradford Council with the aim of getting signs in Haworth that recognise the link. Among many local targets linked to education and the environment, the Mayor has a key ambition to see every child in Machu Picchu speaking some english in 3 years. We hope to help him achieve this target, beginning with links for the schools. The Peruvian children's letters are full of invitations to visit, so in the longer term we're aiming to develop a volunteer programme. Makes 12 large or 20 small profiteroles. 150ml cold water 55g butter, pinch of salt 70g plain flour 2 eggs (plus 2 tablespoons cocoa powder if you want to make chocolate ones) Preheat oven to 190/ gas mark 5

Put the butter, water and salt into the water and heat gently until the butter has melted, and then turn up the heat so it boils fast. Remove from the heat and add the flour, salt and cocoa (if using) and stir like mad with a silicone spatula or bamboo or wooden spoon (just not a metal one). The mixture will form a ball after about half a minute of beating. Tip the ball out of the pan into a mixing bowl.

Lightly whisk two eggs in a cup, and then add a little at a time to the mixing bowl, whisking well in-between. At first the mixture might separate into lumps, but keep whisking and it will become thick and smooth. Scoop (or pipe) tablespoons of mixture into either a mini-muffin pan, or straight onto a well greased baking sheet, forming 12 or more balls, (at least 5 centimetres apart), and bake for 20 – 25 minutes until they are golden brown (don't be tempted to take them out too early or they will just collapse)

Take them out and make a small cut in the side or bottom of each with the tip of a sharp knife,

Summer is here, time for a little indulgence with a glorious dish which can become an impressive pud or a tasty starter, depending on your mood. I always thought profiteroles must be difficult, because they look so, well, difficult! But once I tried, I realised its absolutely simple and really quick: Have a go — and email me your suggestions for other fillings: www.pamperedchef.biz/nel Did you know: A sweet choux pastry is a profiterole or an eclair, a tower of profiterole with a crisp caramel glaze is a croquembouche, and a savoury profiterole is a gougere . Choux pastry was invented in the court of Catherine de Medici in 1540, but later renamed "choux" after the French for cabbage, which the risen profiteroles can sometimes resemble. (but they're not usually green, nor as large).

just to let the steam out; leave to cool on a cooling rack.

While they are cooling, make up a filling, or a selection of fillings and glazes:

Fillings can be put into a small freezer bag with a small corner cut off (or a piping bag or tube if you have one), and piped through the steam hole. Or you can slice the tops off, fill them up and put the top back on. Glazes can make them really special, whether it's the traditional glossy chocolate sauce, caramel cream sauce or some garlicky melted cheese.

For a simple chocolate sauce, melt 100g of dark chocolate with 50 - 75ml cream and 2 teaspoons of vegetable oil in the microwave on 1/3 power for 45 seconds, stir and repeat until melted. Beat until glossy and pour over a pile of profiteroles and sprinkle with raspberries, cherries or nuts. Then take a large spoon, lock the kitchen doors, put up your feet and enjoy!

Here are a few of my favourites fillings: •Traditional Filling: 175ml whipped cream with a few crushed almonds and a teaspoon or two of orange zest folded through; glaze with melted honey and toasted almonds

News from the Worth Valley Joint Transport Committee The "Bronte Scenic Tour", bus service 812, will run every Sunday throughout June, July and August. The bus connects Haworth Station to the principal Haworth coach & car parks, the Bronte Museum and Main Street. and then runs out to Stanbury. Departures from Haworth Station this season are at 1050: 1130: 1215: 1255: 1345: 1430; 1515 and 1600, to connect with all Keighley & Worth Valley Railway trains arriving at Haworth from Keighley. In addition, the first through bus journey to Haworth and Stanbury starts from Keighley Bus Station at 1035. This extra journey plugs a gap in the existing Haworth bus service and creates regular half-hourly Sun morning departures from Keighley to Haworth from 1005 onwards. Three journeys on the 812 bus are extended beyond Stanbury as far as Ponden Reservoir at Scar Top; and four of the return journeys from Stanbury are diverted across the top of Penistone Hill to Marsh Chapel, returning via Marsh Lane and Sun Street to Haworth Station. These provide new journey opportunities for both local people and the many visiting walkers and ramblers to reach deep into the Bronte Moorlands. An attractive Metro pocket timetable and route map is available from KWVR Stations and from Haworth TIC and Community Contact Point. Service provided by Transdev Keighley & District on contract to the WV Joint Transport Committee.


