


"RHYTHM'S GONNA GETCHA!" - GLORIA ESTEFAN

It may surprise you to know that being introduced to music at a young age can help enormously with maths skills. Why? Because when children use beat, rhythm, tempo and melody, they can begin to recognise mathematical patterns. In a toddler's brain, certain neurons in the cortex are actively firing as she plays rhythms on the drum or matches a steady beat by tapping on her lap. Rhythmic and pattern awareness creates neural pathways that are used later for more complex mathematical tasks, so the rhythm of music (and corresponding movements) jump-starts a young child's brain in maths and many other academic areas.

Great thinkers like Einstein and Pythagoras have seen and used the connections between music and mathematics numbers, patterns, proportions, and ratios are just some of the concepts that are mastered by both mathematicians and musicians.

The simple sing-song and tap-clap movements of "Pat-a-cake" and other rhythmic songs, say maths experts, lead to stronger spatial-temporal reasoning. geometry and mathematical skills. Early childhood musical activity sessions, such as Weeny Boppers, provide rich opportunities for children to develop a sense of beat and rhythm through instrument play-alongs, songs and moving in time to music. Counting how out many beats in a rhythmic pattern; translating the 1,2,3 pattern in a piece of music into

a 1,2,3 whole body movement; comparing higher and lower notes, faster or slower tempos, bumpy or smooth beats - all give a simple and fun introduction to measuring and comparing time intervals. ratios and distinguishing between different mathematical units. An enjoyment of music comes naturally to children so they reap tremendous developmental benefits by doing something they love.

To perhaps state the obvious, songs, chants and rhymes such as "Ten Fat Sausages" and "Five Little Speckled Frogs" are a wonderful way to introduce some basic number concepts and deepen young children's knowledge of the counting sequence. Counting songs can help build important foundations in numbers and is great preparation for success in maths. So, bang that tambourine and keep marching to the steady beat . . . your child is off to a great start with patterns!

WINED AND DINED by Claire Smith No. 10 The Coffee House in Haworth



Luscious, juicy and aromatic, the lemon has to be one of my favourite ingredients. Bursting with vitamin C the versatility of these feisty little fruits knows no bounds, and as

far as I'm concerned no kitchen should be without them. Though grown in many Mediterranean countries the best lemons come from Menton, a small village in the south of France, and the Amalfi coast of southern Italy; they are expensive but have the most exquisite aroma and flavour. When buying lemons you need to look for fruit that is heavy and fragrant with a close grained peel. Very pale lemons are older and contain less juice; lemons showing patches of green are under ripe. All lemons will yield more juice when warm so it is important to store them at room temperature moving them to a warm place - a sunny window ledge will do nicely - before squeezing them.

The intense, sunny flavour of the lemon combines well with all manner of ingredients; the vibrancy of lemon juice accentuates the flavour of sauces, makes a good substitute for vinegar in vinaigrettes destined to adorn summer salads and is amazing when combined with the salty stickiness of pan - fried or grilled meat. Fish which is to be served raw is first "cooked" in a marinade of lemon juice. The juice and the zest of the lemon can be used to perfume cakes, pastries and sorbets and to make thirst quenching jugs of home made lemonade.

The juice of the lemon is also a natural

antioxidant; drinking lemon juice in hot water first thing in the morning will cleanse the system; coating peeled fruit and veg in lemon juice will prevent discolouration. Lemon pips are rich in pectin; the pips and the juice will act as a setting agent in jams that are made from fruit with low pectin content such as strawberry, peach or rhubarb. Strips of lemon buried in sugar and left for few days to infuse will give you sugar with a delicate lemon flavour to sprinkle on lemon drizzle cake, pancakes or any sweet lemon - laced dessert. You can open freeze slices of lemon on baking parchment, bagging them up when frozen; these make wonderful "ice cubes" for drinks and cocktails. Squeezed, halved lemons can be saved, the remaining flesh scooped out and open frozen; once frozen they can be used as serving cups for lemon ice - cream and sorbet. Don't forget to slice the ends off so that they will stand level when in use.

Extolling the virtues of the lemon is for me a labour of love. Lemon peel placed in a cooling oven will take away the smell of fish and lemon can be used to remove odours from chopping boards and work surfaces. A piece of lemon placed in the pan when boiling new potatoes will stop them from bursting. Lemon juice when rubbed into the elbows will even soften the skin. Each year in the south of France, the village of Menton hosts the Festival of the Lemon, " a citrus scented celebration " where "huge constructions made from oranges and lemons sway through the streets ". Proof if you need it, that the lemon is thought of by many as one of the most extraordinarily versatile and prized of ingredients.

These regulations have set the following targets for the collection and recycling of waste portable batteries: 25% recycling rate by 2012 and 45% by 2016





Thumbs up for a green lawn!

Following the warning recently of measures to avoid water shortages this summer, which included the advice to stop using hosepipes or sprinklers on lawns, GreenThumb gives some advice as to how to maintain lawns during periods of drought.

Raise the height of cut to a minimum of $1\frac{1}{2}$ - 2 inch's & maintain this throughout the summer months. Avoid mowing the grass at all if there is little or no growth.

Why not invest in a water butt to collect any rainfall that does fall?

Avoid heavy or unnecessary foot traffic on lawns during strong & prolonged sun exposure.

Try to water lawns in the evening when the temperature is lower & the sun low in the sky.

Maintain the feeding of the lawns during the summer months, but avoid the use of feeds which contain iron or that need to be watered in.

Keep weeds to a minimum to avoid competition for nutrients & moisture in the soil.

Lawns don't like shade. Take a good look at those border plants, shrubs and trees – they all have a habit of encroaching on the lawn's space and weakening it by denying it light. Then ... get the secateurs out!

Look out for sickly-looking patches. Leatherjackets, the larval form of the 'Daddy Longlegs' can devastate a lawn in spring as they chomp through the roots of the grass. If you suspect a problem, get professional advice.

With a little time and effort you can have a handsome and healthy lawn for your family to enjoy which is the envy of all your friends and neighbours.





TOP TECH TIPS by Michelle Thompson of CloudFree IT

Who's that using MY network? And what are they up to?

When you first got broadband did you, like most people, rush to un-pack the router, plug it in, insert the setup CD and launch yourself onto the 'information superhighway' like you couldn't wait to start on the road trip of a lifetime across the USA?

Broadband is great, but if you've got a wireless network did you stop to check that it's good and secure first? If you didn't, be prepared for a shock... The popular ISP TalkTalk has warned

that around 2 in 5 domestic wi-fi network users in the UK are now at risk of having their connection hijacked!

Most popular broadband routers arrive with basic security pre-configured. The temptation is to 'plug in and go'! Unfortunately the default or preconfigured settings can leave the router vulnerable to intruders eager for some free wi-fi access! Some routers, particularly those that can be bought in retail stores, arrive with NO SECURITY configured at all!!!

As users upgrade to Wireless-N routers with a much wider signal coverage area, the problem can only get worse. Chances are if you can get a good signal in your shed at the bottom of the garden, so can anyone in the street!

If a hijacker is using your wi-fi, you may notice your connection is slower than usual, but if you're only a light or occasional broadband user you might be unaware that you're sharing yours with an intruder. This is one area where 'share and share alike' is definitely a 'no-no'!

On the external side of a broadband connection a unique IP address is used to connect to the web which can be used to track down wrong-doers. On the inside of your network there may be several computers, games consoles and wi-fi connected mobile phones (and yes, maybe even a wi-fi thief in the street). Each device gets an individual private IP address (e.g. 192.168.x.x or 10.50.x.x), but they're all sharing that single external connection though. What happens on your network, whether it happens within your own four walls or outside in the street, it is your responsibility.

Aside from the obviously illegal internet activities that regularly make the headlines, other less shocking activities are now coming under the careful scrutiny of the government too.

Illegal file-sharing is now being addressed by the new Digital Economy Act 2010, which becomes law on 12th June. This includes a 'three strikes' rule which can result in action against the broadband bill payer such as warning letters, disconnection and even a £500 fine. So if you're not 100% certain your network is secured get some advice from one of your local IT support providers now, before someone takes advantage and leaves YOU disconnected or with a hefty fine! 

However, it is now time for the real work to begin.





Rachel Moore and the Young Farmers Club



The local area provides a number of fine examples of one of the countryside's best kept secrets. No, not a rare plant or animal but a youth organisation which I and my brother and sisters have benefited hugely from being a member of since the age of 10. I refer to 'Young Farmers'; the two local clubs are Worth Valley and Aire Valley YFC.

Young Farmers is open to anyone aged between 10 and 26. It is a National organisation of over 20,000 members which provides a safe environment for young people from the countryside to meet new people, learn new skills, and have lots of fun.

When I first joined Worth Valley YFC about half of the forty or so members were from a farming background. Now, having a count up, there's only about 10 out of our 95 members. As the numbers of farms has declined dramatically since the club was formed almost 70 years ago as a 'calf club' the content of it's meetings has had to change to suit

a wider rural audience and yes, even townies! Yes it's true - you don't have to be a farmer, to be a Young Farmer.

The weekly meetings now contain a wide range of activities including, sports, quizzes, crafts, trips out, and even putting on dramas and pantomimes. Yet despite moving with the times the backbone of the organisation remains intact. The organisation is run by the members for the members and prides itself in producing vibrant young people who can speak confidently in public and demonstrate a sound knowledge of livestock management, and the ability to handle landrovers and tractors as well as perfect a wide range of other rural activities. Keeping these traditions alive is proving to be successful within the two local clubs as the non-farming background members find it all quite intriguing.

Practice of these skills comes in the form of our massive completions programme, the highlight of which, at a Yorkshire level is at the Yorkshire County Show held at Nidderdale Show Ground on 6th June. In addition to over 80 fascinating competitions with members from the 47 clubs from all over Yorkshire fighting it out for glory, our members organise a great country show which is a window into the organisation for the public and fun day for all the family. Come and join us for the day!

Young Farmers also has an awesome social side with regular events attended by over 600 members from across the county. Our clubs also raise money for charities as well as promote causes that our members are passionate about. There are no two finer examples of this

than Worth Valley and Aire Valley YFC who between them have raised over £20,000 for good causes in the past 4 years and recently helped to promote local food networks at the Bronte Vintage Gathering.

So If you are between 10 and 26 check out www.worthvalley.org and come join us. Meet new people, learn new skills and most of all have fun. More than that if you find you've a flair for the more agricultural side of the organisation you could end up being part of the future of British farming, equipped with the skills and knowledge to be able to help us cope with an ever increasing demand for food!

IN THE GARDEN with Mike Cunningham

JUNE

Midsummer heat waves can give you time to relax and enjoy

your garden, but for all its glories June is a busy month for the gardener, theirs always a job to do, growth of plants including weeds is rapid and lawn mowing frequent.

Bulbs:

Spring bulbs where the leaves have yellowed should have been lifted, dried and stored by now. In dry weather don't be afraid to drench your gladioli patch.

Roses:

De-bud (removal of small side shouts) single flowered hybrid tea roses, this helps to promote long stemmed, large bloomed quality roses for cutting and showing. Remove suckers, I prefer to tear away at their source rather than cut. Continue supplementary feeding with a rose fertilizer this will help to develop the very best results. Check for mildew and aphids and spray at first sign. Water roses especially newly planted ones when dry. Weed around the base of roses.

Lawns:

Mowing can be a twice a week job this month. Raking your lawn prior to cutting will help to reduce weeds. Summer drought can soon spoil all your hard work, so spike well to enable hose or rainwater to penetrate to the roots. Do not apply lawn fertiliser or weed killer during very dry weather conditions unless you water in well after. Continue to remove individual weeds using a knife or spotweeder.

Flowering Plants:

Early flowering perennials that have faded should be cut back to just above ground level. Fork and work in a fertiliser such as Growmore, Sea Gold, Bone Meal or Osmacote etc, into soil before re-planting. Half hardy annual such as impatiens, petunia, begonias etc, can be planted out safely as all fear of frost as pasted. Pinch out tips of dahlias, chrysanthemums, pinks etc, to encourage bushy plants. Watch out for sap sucking insects and treat with insecticide at first attack (I prefer to use a systemic type).

Vegetables:

Continue to water and hoe between plants. Earth up potatoes. Nip out broad bean tops as this helps to reduce black fly infestations. Runner beans and outdoor small or bush type tomatoes can be planted (I plant one tomato in a 30 cm [12") diameter pot). Careful planning of crops will easily provide you with the recommended 'Five Veq per Day'.

Container Plants:

Move all planted up hanging baskets, containers etc, to their final position and turn regularly to encourage an even growth on all sides. For a good healthy display you MUST water every day without fail, yes even if it rains.

House Plants:

On warm humid days open some windows, but don't allow them to stand in a draught. If possible move plants outside for a while when light, warm rain falls. Move plants away from south facing windows to prevent scorching.



Mango and Raspberry divine*



This stunning and simple dessert draws together some of my favourite summer tastes - sweet mango, tangy raspberries, zesty lime - and whips them up in a cloud of marscapone and cream with just a whisper of vanilla.

For the mango mousse 2 large or 3 ripe mangoes, peeled and chopped 50g granulated sugar Powdered or sheet Gelatine (or vegetarian equivalent) 250ml double cream 50g icing sugar 1/2 tsp vanilla extract (not essence)

For the lime Marscapone 200g marscapone 250g guark or greek yoghurt 75g icing sugar zest and juice of half a lime 25 ml (or so) milk

250g raspberries, extra lime zest and a little white chocolate to decorate (Makes 6)

For the mango mousse: Whizz the chopped mango in a blender until you have a puree Make up your gelatine according to the

instructions on the packet - you will

need enough to set 750 ml (or about a pint and a half). Melt the granulated sugar in 60ml water (about 30 seconds in a microwave should do this), and whisk into the gelatine mix. Leave to cool while you whip the cream, icing sugar and vanilla extract together until soft peaks form. Whisk the gelatine into the mango puree, and then fold in the whipped cream in a figure of eight motion, a spoonful at a

Set on one side.

For the lime marscapone:

Mix all of the ingredients together well it should just drop from a spoon. Put a few raspberries in the bottom of a martini glass, fill half way with the marscapone and top with the mango mousse. Decorate with raspberries, a grating of lime zest and a sprinkling of white chocolate for extra sweetness. Leave in fridge until set. (a few hours) Summer heaven on a spoon! 
