It seems that at long last spring has arrived, and the collective cheer is almost audible. I have just returned from the stables where Jimmy, the

new love of my life, (sorry Billy) is rapidly losing his winter coat in preparation for summertime, when he will sport with pride, his glossy and gleaming chestnut garments (although he loves nothing better than a good roll in the mud!) He is also desperate to get at the tufts of verdant spring grass beginning to sprout jewellike along the emerald edges of the yard. The leaves on the trees are finally beginning to unfurl, primroses, celandines and wood anemone's can be seen dotted amongst the hedgerows, and gardens are slowly coming back to life. Experts estimate that the cost of our fruit and veg has rocketed by around thirty-four percent in the past five


years, grain prices are also soaring which has had a knock on effect to the cost of meat as a large proportion of these crops are grown for animal feed.

The days however are lengthening, bringing lighter nights, and as I sit writing this the birds outside are still singing at eight thirty in the evening, a positive sign that better things wait just around the corner. Spring may have taken a little longer to arrive but we have much to look forward to, each season, though sometimes unpredictable, remains

eternally rich with promise, often,

when summer gallops in on the back of springtime and everything explodes at once, nature breaks into a carnival of colour, country lanes dressed in clouds of the creamy

white flowers of hawthorn, elderflower, and cow parsley, their perfume carried on gentle summer breezes; flashes of pink campion and cornflower blue; wild strawberry flowers, diminutive and star like and the tiny scarlet fruits that follow. Green grocers shops, their interiors lined with wooden crates cradling cultivated British strawberries, delicately blushing peaches, gleaming red cherries and sweet and tender little garden peas. The earth is teaming with life just waiting to burst forth. In our house we are currently preparing the garden for balmy summer evenings and alfresco suppers; Pimms, champagne with a dash of violet syrup - here's looking forward to a lovely summer.

YOUR DIGITAL AFTERLIFE by Michelle Thompson of Cloud FreeIT

Once upon a time people took their prizepossessions to their grave, but building yourself a pyramid or burial mound in which to store all your goods and chattels ready for the afterlife is probably 'a bit ostentatious' these days, and anyway have you tried getting planning permission around here lately?

There's no pocket in a shroud, or indeed very much room in your standard coffin, so most people leave their precious collections of books, DVD & music collections, photo albums and paper documents, to family and friends to keep or dispose of as they see fit: an arduous task for them.

My kids raid my vinyl, CD and cassette collection, from time to time when they're on the hunt for something a bit 'retro' that isn't available on the streaming services that they favour for their music consumption. In the last few years I switched to buying music from download sites, such as iTunes. It's all on my laptop and gets backed up to an external hard drive. A lot of my photo collection is in boxes and cupboards, but everything from the last 10 years is on my laptop. What a mishmash!

'Hanging onto stuff' clutters up my home and my life, and weighs me down, apparently. Going totally digital would sort that out. I made a start once or twice. honest, but what a long job!

Storing all photos, music and other data 'in the cloud' (and by that I mean on a server in a datacentre somewhere, not in a massive pile of 'UStore' boxes guarded by angels) is becoming the norm. The cloud has to be THE safest place to store your 'digital life' as long as you're careful about security (strong passwords, changed frequently, not shared with anyone). There's no need to worry about hard drives dying suddenly, or losing the lot in a house fire or burglary, and you can access it from anywhere if you need to.

Our collections and mementoes say a lot about us and could be important to our loved ones, but in digital form they could be a lot harder to pass on safely when we shuffle off this mortal coil.

Most of us store email (and attachments) in the cloud without thinking about it. You may not realise just how much good, useful

> and very precious data you have got stored all over the place. What would you like to happen to all that data when you no longer have a use for it? Would you want or need your family to share access to it? Probably.

Worry not! Cunning plans are afoot! New concept alert! 'Your Digital

Afterlife'!

Google intends to give users of their services the option to have their data deleted after 3, 6, 9 or 12 months of inactivity, or have their data sent on to nominated and authorised contacts in the event of their passing. Facebook now gives you the option to 'memorialise' an account after the user's death, so remember when I mentioned 'Digital Footprints' last month, eh? Keep yours clean and tidy!

This is all sounding rather like the handover of control of other assets (e.g. a bank account), so you might want to think about stating your preferences in your will.

You can be sure most online storage providers won't be far behind Google and Facebook. I'll start uploading my millions of photos to the cloud, sooner rather than later. If I start now there'll be fewer piles of 'stuff' for the kids to sort out when I'm gone.


