
the sale of products. (see page 37) This is a great way to shop for Christmas presents and contribute to a good cause. Have a great month, Liz

m ack}$ in September the Brontë Parsonage Museum invited the people of Worth Valley to visit 'behind the scenes' at the museum on a series of special evening events. We were overwhelmed with the response and were sorry to disappoint so many of you, but it was fantastic to hear feedback from local people about what they would like to see on display at the museum. It's so important that the museum connects with local people because there is still so much oral history about the Brontës and old Haworth to be explored. When Patrick Brontë died and the contents of the Parsonage were auctioned off in 1861, many household items were bought by local people. We've been inviting anyone who thinks they might own artefacts, books, drawings and letters belonging or relating to the Brontës to come to a 'Brontëana surgery' and find out more about them, and in the process help us fill gaps in our knowledge about the family and their lives. There have been all sorts of discoveries as people have brought items forward, wondering if their possessions might be of significance. One of our favourites has been a jam pan, which oral tradition has

it, was sold in the 1861 sale and has remained in the possession of a local family ever since. The museum is going to investigate whether it might have been owned by the Brontës. Several wooden items have also been brought along, made from wood taken from the old Haworth church, and an 1834 Haworth rate book. We also saw six books that were believed to have been given to Martha Brown (the Brontës' domestic help) by Arthur Bell Nicholls after Patrick's death. The titles the 'Life of Wellington' and 'Stories of the Irish Peasantry' would certainly fit with the Brontës' idea of interesting reading matter. One member of the public kindly donated to the museum her collection of three volumes of "Family Economist", once owned by Tabitha Brown (the sister of Martha Brown). 'Family Economist' gave monthly advice on how to run a household, with subjects such as 'recipes for making ink', 'moralities for the home' and 'how to make a good cup of tea'. The volumes will be put on display at the museum next year. Thank you to everyone who got in touch and people are still welcome to contact the museum to take part in the Brontëana surgery.

WINED AND DINED by Claire Smith



We have reached the time of year when for me, the sight, sound and smell of hot butter frothing around the edges of a pork steak, a nice piece of

fresh fish, scallops brushed with garlic butter, sliced floury potatoes or a large juicy mushroom or two thrill me beyond reason. A squeeze of lemon iuice, a handful of chopped herbs, the kitchen warm and aromatic whilst the air outside is crisp and cold: the whoosh of par-boiled potatoes falling into piping hot fat, and the crisp roast king Edwards or Maris Pipers, sticky at the edges and soft and fluffy inside that result. As the skilful hand of nature paints the landscape with the golden glow of autumn, the brightly lit windows of our homes take on a magical golden light of their own, leading the way to cosy firesides where winter evenings may be spent sharing snug suppers, and kitchens harbouring pots of gently bubbling soups and warming winter stews.

Winter food is comfort food; the sweet, subtle flavour of a butternut or parsnip soup being meltingly soothing and satisfying on a cool winter day; and the Sunday roast comes into its own now; the meat nestling upon a bed of woody sprigs such as rosemary, thyme or bay, and roasting slowly throughout the afternoon (slow roasting will give a crisp outer skin or crust whilst keeping the meat inside juicy and tender) will fill the house with rich, deeply comforting and nostalgic aromas. Dishes braised slowly at a gentle heat are especially suited to the cooler months. Celery braised in a little stock is gorgeous. Meat and vegetables cooked slowly in seasoned liquid (in a deep, heavy pot) will give you the tenderest meat, aromatic vegetables and pan juices with an enviable depth of flavour.

Potatoes have always featured heavily in our house, due largely to my youngest daughter who has an enduring passion for them. Baked in their skins which should be nicely crisp, their cloudsoft flesh lends itself to a multitude of different fillings, and boiled potatoes mashed with butter (or a little cheese, or cream and mustard, make a perfect blanket for a fabulous fish pie, or a creamy mash mountain with which to mop up the rich onion gravy accompanying a gathering of fat, herby sausages.

All this talk of hearty, winter dinners and suppers leaves little time for desserts, which will not do. This is the time of year , after all, when a pudding is deemed by many (myself included) as compulsory. Blackberry and apple pie, poached pears with ice-cream and chocolate sauce, rice pudding, baked apples, generous wedges of fruit cake, chocolate brownies, in fact any kind of cake; steamed sponges with thick, yellow custard. Warming winter food with which to fortify the body, and the soul.

Any gardener will know that you only have to put a spade or trowel into the ground and a Robin will be there in an instant, singing while you work and waiting for the opportunity to grab a morsel you have uncovered. They are known for being bold and inquisitive.

Why is it that when the leaves fall and you can actually see lots more Robins around, they seem to become more secretive? It is a common belief that this is caused by the rivalry for territory in gardens, and it is certainly apparent. Robins are fiercely territorial and the richer pickings of the well stocked Bird Table are prime sites. No doubt this competition forces them to keep their visits brief.

However, there is another reason. Many of our iconic Christmas Robins spend the majority of their year on the European Continent and migrate here for the milder Winter. [Milder, I hear you say!! Well everything is relative!!] This swells the number, increases competition, and more importantly, the European Robin does not have the same relationship with people as our native Robin.

Why is this? Well it goes back to the days of Wild Boar in Britain – Robins followed them around and as the pigs grubbed up the ground, they provided Robins with a feast. When the Wild Boar were wiped out, fortunately for the Robins, man was there to take over, so they instead followed the spade. This association with Robins is unique to Britain. So if you want to take a photo of a Robin this Winter, it'll be easier if you listen for the one singing in English!!

RURAL MATTERS by Rachael Moore

SEWING THE SEEDS

Autumn is a very busy, but important period in the agricultural calendar. With silage having been picked up from June - September and wheat harvested in July and August, the ground looks pretty bare. A blank canvas awaits the farmer's decision as to what next year's crop should be. Planning to harvest a crop 10 months in advance seems somewhat. optimistic as there are numerous challenges such as the winter weather conditions (frost bite can ruin almost any crop], what markets will be available the following summer, the price of seed and inputs versus returns and finally current ground conditions.

When preparing the land for the crop, its not just as simple as planting a seed. Firstly, the current crop remains must be destroyed to give new seed better chances. The grass could be killed with a herbicide then ploughed or rotivated. This process turns over the sod of soil as well as breaking it up, a bit like a crumble. Following which additional nutrients are applied in the form of farm yard manure and artificial fertiliser. Then it's time for the seed itself to be planted, having calculated the thousands of seeds required per acre, the seed drill evenly distributes them across the field. This is the point where you'll probably notice a fluctuation in bird numbers - scooping as much 'free' seed as they can.

To prevent patchy uptake of the crop and ensure the seed is firmly bedded in,



the land is rolled. The more compact the soil, the better the germination chances. All the aforementioned processes require stringent thought and precision.

Within a few weeks, the first green shrubs begin to peer through the soil. If you look carefully enough, you'll see the rows in which they were planted. Providing the ground temperature is still relatively warm, moist and has light, the grass seeds will thrive. Following a further fertiliser application and some light grazing, this crop will be ready to be harvested the following summer. Similar, but more complex processes are used to plant vegetables

So, when you see a 'naked' field, remember the processes and nurturing that are needed. When you're shopping at the greengrocer's consider the length of time, the inputs and the thought that was involved to grow these products.





THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION is

the national custodian of Remembrance, a role which ensures that those who

gave their lives for peace and freedom are remembered. The act of observing a Two Minute Silence began in 1919 following the Armistice at 11am on the 11th November 1918 at the end of the First World War.

In 1921, the year the Legion was formed, 'Armistice Day' was formally adopted as the national day of Remembrance

and the Legion was charged in its Royal Charter with organising "Festivals of Remembrance, services and parades to perpetuate the memory of sacrifices made during service with Our Armed Forces in war and peace".

In the 87 years which have passed

The Parade and Service at the Cenotaph in Whitehall **on**

Remembrance Sunday organised by the Government and the Legion. Remembrance is not just about

those who fought in the two World Wars of the last century, but also about those involved in the many other conflicts worldwide since 1945 and those still fighting for peace and freedom now. It is also about learning from the past and resolving to make the world a better place to live in the future.

Forces sweethearts from yesterday and today joined hands to launch the 2009 Poppy Appeal in support of the Afghan generation of Armed Forces wounded and bereaved.

Dame Vera Lynn, the original Second World War Forces sweetheart who is once again at the top of the British charts, was joined by Kiwi songbird Hayley Westenra in launching the Poppy Appeal with a fundraising goal of £31 million.

Launching the campaign in a colourful ceremony from London's Horse Guards Parade, well known venue for the annual

Trooping the Colour, Dame Vera was joined by the Regimental Band of the Irish Guards and members of the Queen's Life Guards in full state ceremonial regalia.

My songs were very popular when the boys were away, and now the boys are away again and my songs are popular again," said Dame Vera, 92. "I hope the British public support the Poppy Appeal and for their sake, please

"The Royal British Legion is the leading

UK charity providing direct, practical support for our wounded heroes and bereaved Armed Forces families," said the Legion's Director of National Events and Fundraising, Russell Thompson OBE. " The past 12 months of bloody conflict have increased the need for our help both today and for years to come."

Since 2003, the Legion provided financial help to 10,000 Service personnel and recent veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan. "We represented one-third of all the appeals for higher compensation payments for injuries suffered in Afghanistan," Mr Thompson said. "And, our campaigns have led to increased compensation awards which have placed an extra £7.5 million in the pockets of the most seriously injured."

The Legion currently spends more than a £1 million a week in its work helping over 130,000 other members of the Armed Forces Family – dependents, veterans and the bereaved. This year it hopes to extend its reach more than 160,000 beneficiaries. "In order to fund this work we would like this year"s Poppy Appeal to equal last year's record total of £31 million," Mr Thompson said.



The Royal British Legion's 2009 Poppy Appeal targets support for the wounded and bereaved of Afghanistan with a sobering poster campaign featuring a young war widow and a Royal Marine double amputee, both of them attending the Appeal launch. Using the motto, 'For their

sake, wear a poppy', the Poppy Appeal poster campaign also for the first time features a coffin being repatriated from Afghanistan.


