

## WINED & DINED with Claire Smith from No.10 The Coffee House



Some weeks ago – towards the end of September if I remember rightly – I came across an article by Janet Street – Porter headed "Sorry Nigella, I've

lost my appetite." Commenting upon the pre-Christmas launch of the most recent glut of the ever more glossy offerings from Nigel, Nigella, Jamie and the rest, who, taking advantage of the impending festive season and it's consequential earning potential, are aiming to extract millions from a public desperate to find the perfect gift for the fanatical foodie in their life, she begs the guestion "what can be left to say about whipping up a guick plate of pasta or cooking a chop?," and suggests that these "lavish cookery books suddenly seem as redundant as a monster handbag now deemed passé by the fashion police." I have to admit that she presents a pretty persuasive argument. Though I love to spend time composing new recipes of my own and find myself unable to leave a bookshop without running my fingers longingly across the books nestled in the cookery section, Street-Porter has a point.

Most cooks use only a handful of recipes but will admit to owning drawers, shelves and cupboards that are literally stuffed with cookery books. Though their presence in any home undoubtedly casts an air of domesticity, I wonder if we really do need to own cookery books by the yard all containing more or less the same recipe for a coffee cake, tomato and basil bruschetta etc. If we are honest. how many of the recipes contained within each of these gigantic tomes do we actually use? The answer is probably a couple, half a dozen at best - the other 370 being too exotic, expensive or time-consuming to bother with. This is not to say that I don't find it difficult to imagine never buying another cookery book - I have a healthy respect for the experienced cook and the wisdom afforded by their experience. When it comes to buying cookery books my personal preference is for the writing of Elizabeth David who appears to have a down to earth approach to food and its preparation. But it seems to me that whilst it has almost become a form of domestic escapism to read about how lovely the lives, gardens local shops and endless informal gatherings and dinner parties enjoyed by the likes of Nigella, Jamie and Co are, those of us leading a more earthly existences can get a little jaded with the self congratulating nature of the approach taken by certain celebrity cooks. It can have the effect of making one feel a little Bridget Jones! My grandmother had a couple of cookerv books for inspiration and filled in the gaps herself. Maybe a refreshing change would be that the enthusiastic amateur was offered the encouragement to achieve spontaneity and creativity in the kitchen instead of being cajoled into paying £30 00 to join some celebrity cookery club. I would be

interested to know what you think.



#### The proposed closure of Haworth Fire Station is a

controversial subject. We know that because villagers from not just Haworth but the whole Parish (and neighbours) packed the Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury Parish Council

meeting at West Lane Baptist Church, Haworth on Monday, October 15th to hear an explanation from West Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Service representatives about the plans.

The Parish Council doesn't ordinarily have that many people attend its meetings which emphasised the feelings of the district.

Basically, Fire & Rescue have got to make massive savings in the next few years and the part-time Fire Station in Haworth where there is one fire engine has been put up for closure as part of the re-structuring and cost-cutting plan while, at the same time, the number of full-time fire engines in Keighley would be cut from two to one.

It was revealed during the meeting that the saving in cash terms for closing Haworth Fire Station would be £310,000 annually; that should the Fire Station on Station Road be closed that the site would be sold and the money taken into Fire & Rescue's Funds and that the Haworth fire engine had been called out 64 times in 12 months.

At the same time it was disclosed that there would be an increase in the amount of time a fire engine would take to reach Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury. Those times ranged from a few seconds to possibly 15 to 20 minutes extra. And that raised serious concerns about losses of life as a result of the closure and servicing of the Parish from Bingley or Illingworth if the remaining Keighley engine was otherwise engaged.

It has to be said that Haworth wouldn't be the only station to close and that Fire & Rescue do have to make massive savings.

However, the residents at the meeting made quite clear to the Fire & Rescue representatives that they are very worried by the proposal and the closure of Haworth Fire Station together with the reduction in fire engines in Keighley is exposing our Parish to a substantially increased risk.

Part of the justification of the Fire & Rescue plan was that modern houses are not such a big fire risk but the Parish Council intends to make the case to the consultation, which closes on November 30th, that there are still substantial numbers of old properties in the district; that the risks to life increase dramatically should the Haworth Fire Station close and Keighley lose one of their two engines and that we do not believe their plan for this area is either fair or sustainable. # RURAL MATTERS The Last of the Cowboys by Jonathan Sharp



Let me introduce my self. I am Jonathan Sharp and I am a third generation dairy farmer at Tewitt Hall Farm, the oldest working dairy farm in the Worth Valley, one of only four; so I guess that makes me one of the last of the cowboys!

This summer we held an Open Farm Sunday and were surprised by people's attitude, how little they knew about farming and how much they wanted to learn. So when the editor of The Worth Valley Mag approached me to do some writing for the Rural Matters column it seemed a sensible idea.

At the Open Farm Sunday there were two sessions of milking, feeding and breeding demonstrations. The interest expressed by the visitors was amazing; they were obviously reassured at the high welfare and hygiene of their food production and had many questions for US.

We are an ASDA supplier producing 1.1 million litres: that is almost, but not quiet, the fresh milk requirements of the ASDA store in Keighley.

At the Open Farm event, one lady

asked if she bought her milk from ASDA would it have come from us: she clearly would have changed where she bought her milk on the strength of what she saw. We had nothing but positive feed back so we are considering doing it again.

You may have read about the dairy crisis during the summer. Well it was very real to us, with 4p knocked off the price we received for the milk over a two month period, if it had not been reversed we would have been facing financial ruin by Christmas. I did go and protest in both Leeds and Manchester till the early hours. not easy when you've to milk next morning. At that time the cost of producing a litre of milk was put at 30p (supermarket figures), we believe over the coming months that will rise to over 32p. I currently receive 29p! You may ask how is that possible? Clearly, this is unsustainable. Very simply, I do the work of two men for less than the minimum wage, my father who's 77 still helps 6 days a week and my wife 1 day; I could not do it without them. I am lucky enough to enjoy my job but it is one thing to work long hours for little, and another thing completely when money is leaving with every litre produced which is what we were facing this summer. If the price of milk paid to me had risen with inflation over that past fifteen years I would be getting 39p which would be worth £100.000 to me! The only way we continue to stay in business is because we constantly strive to keep costs down.





## MEN OF WORTH

Commemorating those from the Worth Valley who served our country in times of war



Herbert Chaplin was born at Haworth on 23rd August 1886, educated at Haworth Board School, he followed in his Father's footsteps and trained as a carpenter and joiner. He worked for Briggs and Duxbury of Barnoldswick, helping to build Edmondson's Fernbank Cotton Mill. Aged 39, he attested for WW1 service in December 1915 at Keighley under the Derby Scheme, where men volunteered for service and then returned home until they were called up. Herbert didn't have to wait long and joined the Royal Engineers as a 'Group 12 recruit' in January 1916, continuing his Army training as a 'skilled joiner'.

We know he embarked for France in July 1916, serving overseas for 2 years 46 days. During this time he had ten days leave in September 1917 to marry Annie Chaplin, living with his parents at 10, Ann Street, Brow in Haworth. Returning to the war in France, he received a gunshot wound to his right hand in September 1918 and he was treated at Carrington Hospital in Nottingham where he sent home some pictures of the nursing staff. His 'Blighty Wound' was serious enough to send him home permanently as 'No longer physically fit for war service' and so 146092 Sapper H. Chaplin was discharged in November 1918 with a weekly war pension of 13 shillings and 9 pence.

He was awarded the 'Silver War Badge' which was worn to show war injury, because of the stigma sometimes attached to men who were of service age but not serving in the armed forces. Herbert later worked at Ebor Mill in Haworth. Annie died in 1951 aged 64 and Herbert died in 1975 at 89. They lay together at Haworth Cemetery on Penistone Hill.

# TOP TECH TIPS by Michelle Thompson of Cloud FreeIT

#### The Tablet - is it death of the laptop?

Got a loved-one dropping elephantsized hints about how nice it would be to find some technology in their Christmas stocking?

Sorry for mentioning the 'C-word' before 1st December, but in the run up the market gets a bit swamped with new 'must-haves' and special offers on last year's 'can't-livewithouts'.


Apple's iPad has been around for a few years now and expensive though it might seem it is still the tablet market leader but, now that various vendors have got competing products available at various price points,

touch-screen tablets are set to be a huge hit this year.

Despite being more expensive than an iPad the new Microsoft Surface sold out in the UK, BEFORE its official launch date on 26th October (much frantic pre-ordering by over-excited gadget lovers, but more civilised than pre-launch queuing out in the cold the night before, eh Apple?)

From around £200 you can get an Android-based device. The iOS-based iPads start at around £350 and the new Windows RT-based Microsoft Surface starts at £399.00. Despite big price differences they have lots in common. Data is stored on flash memory (no spinning disks), the screens are generally between 7 and 10.6 inches diagonally. Efficient, low-power consumption processors mean there's very little heat output (so no hot thighs!). Low power consumption + smaller screen – hard drive = less battery weight. Properly portable! At the lower end of the market internet connectivity is wi-fi only, but higher up the market some devices include built-in 3G so you really can access the internet from anywhere.

Naturally, less power and data storage than a PC means a tablet device won't completely replace a laptop or desktop (yet). Most avid tablet users still retain a



In addition to email/web access, I use my tablet for:-

• Taking notes quietly in meetings (no clacking laptop keyboard). I don't have to decipher my own awful handwriting and can quickly turn notes into a proper word processed document at the office later, or email them straight out as they are.

• Social networking from the comfort of my sofa

• Internet TV and movies in the kitchen (or in bed)

• Carrying days' and days' worth of music to plug into my car stereo

Basic word processing, spread sheets and quick
photo editing

• Getting my jumbled ideas into order (there's a very handy brainstorm app for that!)

• Playing games (my favourites are Scrabble and puzzle games, but there's 1000's available)

• Reading e-books

So in short, tablets fit neatly in between smartphones and laptops. They really are 'slip it in your handbag' portable, yet big enough to make browsing the web, checking your email and watching TV or movies on the hoof a pleasure.

## **Participatory Budgeting** What does it mean?

Participatory Budgeting is a process which allows members of a community to participate in making spending decisions about local things that affect them.

I've been asked by our Parish Council Chair Person, John Huxley, to put this offer to the residents of Stanbury; it is an opportunity to take part in a pilot scheme. Stanbury will be the forerunner of PB. In essence local people can put forward a proposal and if the community agrees with that proposal and it is accepted, then it should ao ahead.

The money has to be spent on things that improve the area on a sustainable level. This is a way for people to get involved in all sorts of things that are practical and affordable. So far, more than a dozen communities and parish councils have taken up the challenge and benefitted from the PB Scheme.

A meeting for the Stanbury Residents is to be held at St. Gabriel's Church, Stanbury on Wednesday 14th November 2012 at 7.30 pm. There will be an information brochure and a short DVD showing how villages in rural areas have used the monies that they have been given to improve their village.

Some of the things that other communities proposed were re-decorating their village hall, green energy solar panel installation, refurbishing the local bowling green, a music festival, a youth club helping young people towards employment, planting fruit trees and new books for the local school and church. The projects that went ahead were supported by a team of people looking to champion their idea for the good of their community. It will be very interesting to hear what schemes our Stanbury residents will put forward.

It must be said at this point in time I have not been informed how much money will be available, however, I hope that this will become clear at the meeting on the 14th November.

It is my understanding that all the villages and its residents benefitted from this social scheme and it created a good sense of community spirit.

If the Participatory Budgeting Scheme is successful in Stanbury, it could be rolled out for the benefit of the residents of Haworth and Cross Roads in the future. This could be an excellent opportunity to spend money in our parish for the benefit of the people who live here. Cllr. John Suckling. Stanbury 643998
