No words can describe the heartache of loss:





Yorkshire artists create poignant reminder in the sand on D-Day beach

In September two Yorkshire sand artists captured the imagination of the world when

they created a vast sand art project on one of the beaches which featured in the D-Day landings in France. They lead a team of volunteers to make 9,000 sand drawings, representing the souls who lost their lives there during World War II.

Jamie Wardley and Andy Moss, from Bradford, came up with the idea of The Fallen to mark Peace Day. They created stencilled drawings in the sand of the 9,000 civilians, German forces and Allies who died at Arromanches on 6 June 1944. The silhouettes were drawn on the beach at the rate at which they fell only to be totally erased by the incoming tide, as their own lives were.

"The Fallen is a sobering reminder of what happens when peace is not present. The idea was to create a visual representation of what is otherwise unimaginable – the thousands of human lives lost during the

hours of the tide during the WWII Normandy landings on 6 June 1944. There is no distinction between nationalities, they are known only as 'The Fallen'. The mass participation event did not propose to be a

celebration or condemnation, simply a statement of fact and tribute to life and its premature loss," said Jamie.

The project was funded by Sand In Your Eye, with support from local building merchants, Uriah Woodhead, who supplied all the materials.





I always think that November deserves big bowls of deeply satisfying, flavoursome food, with warming spices and enough substance to fill us up without overindulging. This dish is all of that and more, being packed full of healthy stuff too.

It's not like the more familiar Asian curries. but the word "stew" doesn't really do justice to the pungent flavours and spices which bring this dish to life.

African sweet potato curry offers plenty to vegetarians and is surprisingly appealing to carnivores alike, but if you really want some meat alongside it, try some chicken thighs marinated in a harrissa pasta and roast with finely chopped preserved lemons and pistachios.

This dish is very forgiving - a bit more or less of any of the ingredients wont make much difference; and the spicing is mild medium, so add or reduce as you wish to make it your own.

It feeds around six hungry people.

3 good sized sweet potatoes, peeled and chopped into 1 inch chunks

1 large or 2 small onions of any sort, peeled and coarsely chopped

2 cans of chopped tomatoes

600ml stock - vegetable or chicken are good

about 100a of peanut butter

spinach - about 8-10 of the frozen portions, or a biggish bag of fresh - as much as you like really.

1 tsp chilli

1 tsp cumin

1 tsp cayenne pepper

1 tsp dried coriander

a thumbs length of fresh ginger, grated, or a tsp of dried or from a jar

2 - 4 garlic cloves to taste.

a spoonful or so of oil

A handful of fresh coriander to sprinkle on top

Soften your onions over a low heat in a big pot (probably the biggest you have) and then soften the garlic too. Add your spices and stir through for a minute or so and then add the sweet potato and stir until coated. Add the tomatoes, stock and peanut butter and turn up the heat until it starts to bubble. Then turn back down to a low heat, and simmer for 40 minutes or so until the sweet potato softens. Add the spinach and simmer for another 10 minutes uncovered. If it needs longer to thicken, that's fine.

Serve with a big bowl of salad and flatbreads. You probably wont need rice as well, but if you do, flavour it with some lemon zest, jiuce and fresh coriander to really compliment the curry.

Like many spiced dishes, the flavours intensify overnight, so you can expect this to become a favourite lunchtime leftover to warm the coldest winter afternoon.





Holden Hall Users Group was formed in March 2012 after Holden Hall was threatened with closure.

"HHUGs provides an opportunity for a voluntary Management Committee to influence BMDC building use policy: ensuring fees are competitive and monitoring use to ensure the building maintains a local focus. Providing much needed services for the whole community and focusing on key priority groups such as the young and older people" said resident Shaun O'Hare.

It is providing for young people that drives many of the members in the

Over recent years, it has been difficult for BMDC Youth Services to maintain a youth worker presence in the village due to a lack of resources, both human and financial. Youth Service recognised the fantastic opportunity to work in partnership with HHUGs in an attempt to provide something substantial and long term for the young people

After consultation with young people in the

village and a commitment to the project from a number of organisations a successful application for funding was submitted to Awards for All

The £7800 from the Lottery and support from Youth Service will provide for a weekly youth club which mixes traditional youth club activities with training opportunities in areas including catering and hospitality.

"HHUGs acted on the results of the consultation and the club will offer Zumba and Street Dance, DJ workshops and Arts & Crafts as well as all the resources necessary to enable the young people to prepare and sell snacks, with revenue from the sales reinvested in the project, hopefully helping to sustain the club".

A local training provider will be offering the young people aged 11+ accredited training in food preparation, hygiene and business, skills which will improve their chances of accessing future employment and provide a diversionary activity to anti social behavior The youth club will be running weekly from

announcement of the final Grand Depart route on Wednesday, October 23.

Around the Aire and Worth Valleys, the news everyone was anticipating was that the route is going to take riders up the cobbled Haworth Main Street. The decision was obviously hailed as a huge challenge for the cyclists – but what a terrific backdrop for film makers recording the spectacle!

The other major announcement affecting our near neighbours was that the route has been amended to take the tour through Skipton centre.

As our whole community awaited the news from Paris, Stanbury village school got into the spirit - braving wind and rain to take a tour to Hollywood. That's **Project Hollywood**, Oxenhope!

The whole school – just over 100 children – set out to see the mysterious 10ft sign on the hillside above Shaw Lane. They were joined by French entertainers, Zef - a troupe of traditional musicians from the Bordeaux region who were visiting the school as part of the children's art week.

Headmaster Graham Swinbourne said: "I wanted to raise the profile of the Tour with the children and we've been explaining that it's the biggest cycling event in the world and what it will mean to our area. What better way to do this than a visit to 'the big bike'!' I also wanted them to see a sculpture during art week. We'd already organised for Zef to come and play for us – so it all tied in really nicely."



Worth the Tour is also working with Haworth sculptor Craig Dyson who's revealed that he will be creating a major work to celebrate the event - something which embodies true grit; the qualities of Yorkshire and The Tour de France. Craig's working title is 'Underdogs', as he was inspired by the success of Welcome to Yorkshire in bringing such a huge event to our area in the face of fierce competition. He aims to join together thousands of 2p coins into around 100 spheres to form a 3D sculpture. Craig had to get permission from the Royal Mint to use the coins in this way, as part of the sculpting process.

Worth the Tour will co-ordinate a massive 'TuppenceWorth' campaign to

collect the coins – engaging the whole community. Anyone from the smallest child who "gives Tuppence" will be playing a part in the creation. Craig runs creative workshops in local schools and wants to get the children involved in helping to collect the coins.

Fields of Vision is a route animation project involving a series of 12 land art-scapes alongside the Day 2 route. Turf Sculptors will sow images into the fields, with Young Farmers planting the seeds helped by community sowers - including volunteers and schoolchildren.

Artworks would vary from huge drawings in different coloured grass, to images created by techniques like scorching, pitch

marking, cutting and mosaic.

Sites stretch from Blubberhouses to Holmfirth and include some fields as big as football pitches and some on slopes like reservoir banks so they can be seen from far and wide. The art works would be viewed from the air as the tour passes, as well as having a designated viewing point from the ground across the valleys. That way a trail can be created for visitors to follow later.

Pennine Prospects, the rural regeneration company for the South Pennines, is leading on Fields of Vision in partnership with Young Farmers, Worth the Tour, the Sports Turf Institute in Bingley and other partners in Calderdale.

October's Worth the Tour meeting took us, for the first time, to Keighley – and was held in Central Hall, attracting another great turn-out.

Northern Passion & Ambition Worthy of the Brontës

There are rumours being whispered that a new film is heading for the moors. Director David Anthony Thomas speaks to Worth Valley Mag discussing the Brontës, his love affair with Haworth and the rumours of an A-List cast.

Those who visit or live in the Worth Valley are used to the sites connected to the Brontës. Many are said to have influenced specific stories while others, including the world famous parsonage, are part of the story of the Brontës themselves. It's this story that young film maker David Anthony Thomas has set his sights on, as he plans his first big budget movie about Haworth's most famous daughters. "I've always seen their lives as the ultimate Brontë novel," he says, "The vast majority of their works were inspired by the people around them and the events that shook them, so the novels are the key to understanding each sister's response to these people and the events in their lives."

David is based in Yorkshire and, in 2012, he directed and shot film-short. "The Business of The Day", in the Worth Valley. The World War I film, which deals with subjects likes desertion and rank. was hailed by critics and screened at the Cannes Film Festival. Since then, Thomas has directed another short, Solitary Trees, examining Winston Churchill's relationship with the press which, Thomas says, shows clear parallels to the modern Leverson enquiry. "To my knowledge nothing of the kind had been attempted before, so I'm very excited to get it out there," he said. His film company, Clothworker Films, may be a relatively new but is certainly "packing a punch". he savs.

We ask him whether this means the rumours of Rupert Grint, star of the Harry Potter Films, taking up the part of Bramwell Brontë are true. David remains candid, explaining that he can't reveal anything until contracts are signed, but

hints that someone big is in the offing. "The Grint rumour isn't true, though people aren't far off the mark and it's great that they're thinking along the right lines. It'll certainly have an A-list cast, and the crew already includes those who've worked on the likes of The Dark Knight trilogy, James Bond and X-Men," he reveals.

Despite Hollywood links talk of a £10million budget, David's boots remain firmly on the Worth Valley ground. "Many people have expressed concern that Yorkshire rarely features as a backdrop in any of the works inspired by the family, which I think is a huge shame for the region. One of my aims is to change that and to create a film that lives and breathes Yorkshire, as it should, and uses many of the original locations. The decentralisation of the British film industry to more northern cities like Manchester

will be a great assistance in achieving this realistically.

"You could say that this is Yorkshire coming together to make a film about its proudest residents. We're predominantly targeting world-renowned, Yorkshire-born talent because they grew up with the Brontës. I'm looking forward to the film benefitting Haworth and Worth Valley throughout and following the film's production."

Ultimately, though, the film is clearly born out of Thomas' passion for the work of the family. "I've always been a Brontë nut and creating something like this has always been a dream project of mine. I want to make the definitive project on the Brontës and a 2016 release will make it a perfect 200th birthday present for Charlotte.

With the imminent launch of the Tour de France Grand Depart legacy programme on the horizon, Chief Executive of City of York Council, Kersten England, speaks to Worth Valley Publishing editor, Liz Barker, about legacy, women and cycling.

How did you land the exciting opportunity to lead on legacy for TDF2014?

Inevitably there is a bit of 'right place right time' about this! But in truth York was very supportive of the bid to host Le Grand Depart because we have been a designated cycling city for over a decade. Close behind Oxford and Cambridge York is a place where people cycle more often than any where else in the U.K. We've learned a lot about building the right environment for cycling and we're happy to share that with the region. It's also true that it is a team effort and that other parts of the country are already very strong in terms of leisure and elite cycling.

What do you hope will be the main things Yorkshire will gain from hosting TDF2014?

It will bring a huge welcome boost to our local economy - estimated to be worth about £100 million - creating short term and permanent jobs. The world will see how beautiful "god's own country" is and want to visit us. It will inspire a generation to get active on their bikes and get healthier.

Are you a cyclist?

Absolutely - love my bike!

Do you have a favourite cycle route in the Worth or Aire Valley?


I love the back roads over the tops, west out of Ilkley, that bring you round into Silsden and then onto East Morton. In the Worth valley I love walking and running - having done the Haworth Hobble twice. The route over past Lower Laithe reservoir with Stanbury visible over on the ridge, past Bronte waterfalls up to Top Withins and over the moors is very special to me.


Is there a particular role for women in the Tour de France legacy that you hope to bring to the fore?

There is, quite rightly, a big push for women's elite cycling to be recognised for the fantastic sport and spectacle which it is. Champions like Lizzie Armitstead and Hannah Barnes are stunning role models, inspiring women to push the boundaries and follow their dreams. In our legacy work we have set a very clear ambition to get more women cycling and are working closely with both Skyrides and the Breeze networks, to encourage women to get on a bike, many for the first time. We also plan to have more elite women's events in Yorkshire.

Where will you be on July 7th 2014 and what will vou be doing?

On July 7th 2014 I will be recovering from the stage 2 start of TDF 2014 on the Streets of York! All being well I'll be having a day off to relax and enjoy day 3 of the U.K. Grand Depart as a spectator rather than organiser of the event.





Technology - helping you to fitness both outdoors and in.
