September; the month which heralds the onset of Autumn. Hedgerows are heavily laden with plump autumn fruits, some swollen almost to the point of bursting, the boughs of the plum, apple and pear bend under the weight of their steadily ripening crop and the burgeoning life in everything around us has flourished to the point when all of nature may benefit from the result. There are hazelnuts and blackberries to gather, fruit syrups, jellies and iams to prepare before the last of the summer fruits vanish completely, fruit pies and chutney's to stash away in the freezer and upon pantry shelves. At the time of writing I am keeping a weekly vigil over the sloes growing in one of my favourite childhood haunts. Once they have been through their first frost I will pick as many as posssible and make bottles of sloe gin which will be allowed to mature for an entire year before we break into them and take our first sip of the dense, sweet nectar inside.

A well-stocked larder generates a sense of security,a feeling that one could always sustain oneself.The larder, or pantry as it was known in our house has always had a particular allure for me. Recollections of my grandmothers pantry in particular hold the power to transport me back to childhood, to Friday teatimes spent at her house. My grandmother's pantry seemed like a magical kingdom; entering that kingdom was like passing through the wardrobe doors into Narnia. Stacked one upon the other were tins embossed with rows of brightly coloured flowers, gilded and gleaming; tins in the style of Wedgewood Jasperware, pale blue with overlaid white figures

representing the muses and figures found on classic Greek and Etruscan vases, all containing different cakes and biscuits - cut and come again chocolate cake, ginger biscuits that were crunchy on the outside and wonderfully chewy in the middle and pink meringues. I nearly always went for the meringues but would lift the lid on all the tins just for the thrill of looking at and inhaling the aroma of the contents of each one.

There is something rather wonderful about shelves holding rows of jars containg ingredients; for me they hold the power to inspire and entice - there is more than a touch of the exotic about them. I have never quite got over a kitchen which I had the privilidge to pop into some years ago; teaming with glass jars, bristling with activity and emanating warmth and the fantastic aromas of the food being prepared by the fabulous cook that it belongs to, it seemed like a world all on its own - a world where magic and artisrty took place.

Being a local girl born in Lees and growing up in Crossroads I retain many happy memories of the area. Long, warm summer holidays spent outdoors enjoying the spectacular countryside, cold winters sitting next to my mum and a warm open fire which is how my career startedwatching her knit. Little did I realise that was to be the very beginning of my career!

On leaving school, I joined a local textile company as a junior knitter which meant knitting eight hours a day mainly working on new product to make sure the yarns could achieve what was required regarding tension, strength and 'general knit-ability'. This hands-on experience proved invaluable and a true test of my career path. Working for Hayfield Textiles in Glusburn seemed a long way from Crossroads, whereas today I travel throughout Europe and even have a book signing trip to New York in October!

Hayfield Textiles also gave me the opportunity to progress and I became a junior designer before moving to The Robert Glew Group (brands Emu, Robin and Studley Yarns) where I worked my way up to the role of Chief Designer. This allowed me to develop my personal style across a wide variety of yarns. As Chief Designer I also worked with a technical team developing new yarns, whereas today I work with yarns from a number of diverse countries such as Japan, Chile, Italy and Turkey. During this period I also started a family and now have three children Timothy (23), Joshua (18) and Ellie (15) of whom I am very proud and, in turn, they have been really supportive of my time consuming career over the years.

In 1993 I worked as Chief Designer for Sirdar, based in Wakefield, working with an incredible team of enthusiastic and talented people.

Together with my family's support, I made the decision to work as a freelance designer which allowed me flexibility to initially work from home. What started off with one client grew very quickly and today I work for most of the major UK knitting companies, including local companies Designer Yarns, Stylecraft (both in Keighley), James C Brett (Bingley) and King Cole Yarns (Silsden).

By and large people love saving money buying exactly what they want online and having the freedom to check a bank balance at 2am (although some won't admit to it]! Keeping in touch with friends and family in far off places, without the hassle of going to the post office (if there still is one nearby) is a joy. Kids get online homework via Virtual Learning Environments, so they can't use that old 'dog ate my homework' excuse anymore! But Oh! How bitterly we complain! So much information is only available on online, the town centres are dying, and no-one knows how to write a proper letter anymore. Some you win. Some you lose!

Changes in commerce and communication affect most those who are comfortable with the old ways. There's no stopping the rampant march of progress through our daily lives though, because the masses demand it. Once it's proved that there's money or time to be saved, tradition goes out of the window.

We must accept change, because 'Resistance is Futile. Folks'! No-one could halt the Industrial Revolution or the development of radio and TV either.

Nowhere to buy music by less well known artists on CD (or vinyl)? It's iTunes, Spotify or Zune these days, unless you fancy a long drive! Want a specific book? Download it and save space on your shelves! Why bother recording TV programmes? Watch what you want on your computer,

smartphone or tablet device in peace. TV on demand means fewer arguments over the remote!

Hate commuting? Work at home! Want a repeat prescription? Order it online via your GP's website and make one trip, not two, to collect it. Telemedicine will one day enable us see, hear and speak with health professionals and get things like blood pressure checks without leaving the house. Ideal if you're less mobile than you once were or live miles from the nearest surgery or hospital!

Even though most of the UK's population lives where ADSL is available, there's a big snag. Those of us already online compete for internet bandwidth. At home we've got laptops, desktops, tablets and phones on our wireless network. Our connection just can't cope! It's 4 mbps allegedly up our street on ADSL, but more like 1 or 2 mbps most of the time and sometimes the connection drops altogether. Before the days of internet TV, online gaming, YouTube and Facebook 1 or 2 mbps seemed superfast! Now we download in shifts!

Network infrastructure upgrades will bring faster broadband to some areas through 'Fibre to the Cabinet' (FTTC). The Government has pledged to make the UK the best place in Europe for broadband by 2015, but the telecoms companies sav it's not commercially viable to provide even basic ADSL, in some areas. Manv rural residents and businesses find that even though they could benefit more than most from access to the internet. it's not available.

Community groups are encouraged to apply for public funding to bring fast broadband into rural areas, so people in places like the Upper Worth Valley can keep up with the Internet Revolution too. Fair-trade Autumn Pudding



Nothing says autumn like, "APPLES".

A yummy scrummy way to use up windfalls, with the added delight of fairtrade dried fruits and nuts. And if that wasn't enough, an extra indulgent hot toffee sauce to finish it all off!

125g butter, softened

175g caster sugar (billingtons golden fairtrade is best) 1 local egg from Marsh Top Farm (other eggs are available, but these are so much nicer) 150g plain flour

1 teaspoon of baking powder

1 teaspoon or more of nice spices - mixed spice, or cinnamon, ginger or nutmeg - or even cardamon 4 apples, peeled, cored and chopped into 1 cm pieces a handful of your favourite fair trade dried fruits - I like chopped up figs best

a handful of your favourite fair trade nuts, chopped - pecans, almonds and walnuts are all delicious with apple, but so are lots of others too Grease and line a deep cake tin with greaseproof paper (the sort of tin you would make christmas cake in. Heat the oven to gas mark 4/ 180.

Whisk the butter and sugar until very light a fluffy - an electric mixer does this best, Slow down the beating and add the beaten egg, and then the flour, baking powder and spices.

With a spoon, stir in the fruit, and then spoon the mixture into the cake tin, and bake for about 40 minutes until brown on top.

Take out of the oven and allow to cool for 10 mins or so, before carefully tipping out of the cake tin and removing the paper.

While it is cooling a bit more, make the toffee sauce: 200g caster sugar, 250ml whipping cream and a tablespoon of butter, plus vanilla essence if you have some in.

Using a small, heavy bottomed saucepan, pour the sugar into the saucepan and cook gently until it starts to melt around the edges. using a long handled spoon, bring the edges in towards the middle and keep moving the sugar around until it is melted, Dont let it burn!. Take it off the heat, and put an oven glove on your hand. Using your protected hand, pour in half the cream and stir quickly - it will spit. stir well until combined, and then add the rest of the cream, the butter and the vanilla. You can even add a tot of whisky if you like...

Serve while warm over the pudding, and

dont expect to move for at least an hour afterwards. Enjoy!

COMMUNITY-LED PLAN



During the last few months Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury Parish Council has been preparing to face any challenges that

Parish (Ilr John Huxley the Government's

Localism Bill might present. As yet we're still very short on detail because the Bill isn't expected to be published until November. But it's already becoming clear that the role of Parish Councils is likely to assume a far greater significance than it does at the moment.

As part of those preparations the Parish Council has already agreed in principle that we would like to put in place a Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) and we're participating in the re-writing process of the existing Parish Plan as a 'Community-Led' Plan.

The NDP will be an urgent piece of work for us. The Government is making changes to Planning Law and this will pretty much ensure that developers will have a far easier ride when it comes to making Planning Applications.

Having an NDP will give us a legal say in the process. However, the formation of such a plan is both expensive and time consuming. In basic terms all the community has to be consulted; a draft plan constructed and submitted to Bradford Council for approval as it will have to match their regional planning structures.

When that process is complete it goes to an independent scrutiniser and they give it the nod, then we go to the community for a referendum on the document.

After we've jumped through all those hoops we'll have a document that says where house building will be allowed and where it will be discouraged; where commercial buildings can be erected and what building design styles must be adhered to. Most importantly, it will be a legally binding document. Unfortunately creating an NDP is expected to cost in the region of £20,000 and there are serious worries for Local Councils with regarding to funding.

The Community Led Plan will put down a blueprint about what Haworth, Cross Roads and Stanbury communities want in the way of services and facilities for the future; how they see the district developing and what they think about the management of the landscape.

Our Plan is being used as study document for a European project and we're working on that with the Airedale Partnership regeneration team in Keighley.

Consultation will be the name of the game so keep an eye out for a meeting near you. Remember if you don't have your say, expect to receive what you are given. We'll be in there fighting for our communities and we need your backing.

KRIS HOPKINS MP ON LOCALISM



"All politics is local" is a well-worn phrase, first coined by legendary US Congressman Thomas 'Tip' O'Neill.

But in this country, it will gain a whole new resonance once the Localism Bill is approved by Parliament in a few weeks' time.

The Localism Bill, currently being debated in the House of Lords, includes a significant number of new powers and freedoms for councils, changes to the planning system to make it more democratic and a series of reforms to ensure that decisions about housing are taken locally.

The people who know, love and cherish their area will be given the power to protect, plan and nurture the development of that area.

Developers will be forced to negotiate with these committees made up of local people. Any resources offered by developers will not be swallowed up by bureaucracy, but will instead be placed in the hands of these local committees to be used for the benefit of the community.

To be granted planning permission, developers will have to consider the needs of residents which will encourage more business involvement locally. They will have to take into account what residents want and work to deliver aesthetically pleasing, carbon neutral plans that will benefit the community, the environment and the economy.

With such measures it will become easier to preserve areas of outstanding natural beauty such as the Moors, loved by locals and many millions of tourists alike, which might otherwise be at risk from bulldozers and concrete mixers.

The Localism Bill also incorporates provisions to allow a community to trigger a referendum on any local issue. And I have one specific question that I would wish the people of Keighley and Ilkley to have the opportunity to answer in such a referendum.

Namely, do you wish to break away from Bradford Council control and set up your own, independent local authority?

I do not have the space here to rehearse the many arguments for why I believe the answer to that question should be a resounding "YES!"

Suffice to say that I believe such an outcome – possibly alongside a similar referendum in the Shipley parliamentary constituency – would provide much better quality local representation and significantly improved value for money for people who live here.

And, given the impending threat of a directly-elected mayor for the whole of Bradford district, it will stop someone from that city telling us what we can and cannot do.

Be assured that you will hear much more from me on this subject in the months ahead.

Planning Minister Greg Clark is urging councils to give greater attention to applications from voluntary and community groups who know their area and often have innovative ideas to make the best of local assets. That doesn't mean special treatment or an automatic green light but it might mean that communities know that their hard work and enthusiasm will not simply be met by a blank face or stuck at the bottom of a never ending in-tray. Under the new guidance, local authorities would also have to respond formally, outlining the reasons behind their decisions. This will shine the light of transparency on council decisions about assets in their local area. The new guidance to local authorities builds on the Government's determination to hand power back to local people. The Localism Bill will give bold new powers



to local people to protect and improve their community assets and will enshrine in law the opportunity for community and voluntary groups to have a greater say over what happens in their local area. In the mean time, what happens to Holden Hall!? Locally, a consultation process is underway to consider the options available to the community for the continued use of Holden Hall. As this publication goes to press, representation of local opinion (including 1,500 signatures), is being sought to take to City Hall in Bradford Oct11th. Oakworth Forward is championing the issue and Holden Hall Action Group can be found on the village website oakworthvillage.com
