Local residents and interested passers-by gathered on the village Main Street to view the event that was history in the making. Saint Gabriel's church, initially created as a chapel of ease for Haworth Parish

Church, was built in 1848. It has been in continuous use since then and remains the heart of the community hostina village events and is the central place for Christian worship. Last year Stanbury parishioners and local residents made their desire known to use the church for weddings. "The building is lovely and the perfect location



for an intimate gathering," said former parish councillor and Stanbury resident, Lesley O'Brien. "Now that Saint Gabriel's is licenced we are delighted to see it used for weddings." Congratulations to Simon Rushworth and Julie Laycock for being the first to walk down the isle at Saint Gabriel's and into our local history books.

These easy to make no bake, no fuss Granola bars are a perfect snack for their back to school lunch box and feature a fuelling mix of nuts, oats, brown rice and dried fruit. The bars are low in fat and processed sugar and full of slow-releasing carbohydrates which are great for keeping energy levels up throughout their school day.

If you like this recipe – we have lots of fantastic recipes to pick up for free in the farm shop to give you further inspiration for a whole range of fabulous, affordable treats using our great seasonal produce.

Ingredients - Makes 24

- 2 cups puffed brown rice cereal (unsweetened)
- · 2 cups rolled oats
- · 1/4 cup roasted almonds, chopped
- · 1/4 cup roasted sunflower seeds
- · 1/2 cup shredded coconut
- . 1/2 cup dried fruit, chopped
- · 1/2 cup peanut butter
- · 1/2 cup honey
- · 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup mini chocolate chip (optional)



- Combine cereal, oats, nuts, seeds, coconut and fruit in a large mixing bowl.
- 2 Heat the peanut butter, honey and vanilla in a small sauce pan until warm. Do not boil.
- 3 Pour the peanut butter mixture over the cereal mixture. Mix well while honey is still warm. I use my hands as they are the best tool for this mixing job!
- 4 Pour mixture into a 9x13 pan.
- 5 Pack the mixture down firmly with moist fingers or the bottom of another 9x13 pan sprayed with cooking spray.
- 6 The chocolate lover should sprinkle on the mini chocolate chips at this point and press them in firmly.
- 7 Cover with plastic wrap, and cool completely. Once cool cut into 24 bars.

These Granola bars will sit in the fridge for up to 2 weeks and they still taste great!

















Did you get a chance to view the large painting that was displayed on Haworth Main Street to celebrate the Worth Valley and welcome the Tour de France?

A mural depicting the many facets of local life and the attractions of the valley was painted by Haworth artist, Vic Buta. Vic worked in association with the community group 'Worth The Tour'. The project was devised by Oakworth resident Russell Brown and the giant painting is called Tour d'art II.

Following the success of an initial pilot project (Tour d'art) where the local residential home 'Rough Nook' was featured in a 1940's travel poster style canvas, the second painting aimed to magnify the scale and create an even more ambitious piece.

"The idea was to capture the enormity of the event. We wanted it to be big and also to encompass the enthusiasm and joy of the Tour d'France in a creative way that would have legacy value. The work will

remind us of the great event that caught the attention of the world. We hope to find a suitable venue to display the mural where it can continue to inspire the community and visitors alike," said Russell Brown. Postcards have been printed with the hope of covering some of the costs associated with creating and displaying the mural.(see page 30).

"We are still out of pocket as there was no funding for this project. But the work has been so well received; we know the community is behind us. The tricky thing is finding an interior space that is open to the public and large enough to display Tour d'art II. We have some options. A local community minded business has approached us and we will see how that develops."

Leeds City College Star Centre

A part-time Astronomy GCSE course, aimed at enthusiasts and amateur stargazers, is scheduled to relaunch this month in Keighley after some stellar results over the last two years.

16 year-old Cassie Barlow-Hall from Silsden was among the latest group of learners of all ages studying the GCSE part time at The STAR Centre at Keighley Campus, Leeds City College. She was over the moon after getting an A* grade in August, which she hopes will help her fulfil her ambition of studying astrophysics at university.

The STAR Centre is a specialist science hub that uses space as a theme to encourage learners into undertaking STEM subjects – Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths. The GCSE course runs half-day a week for a year. Learning is in a small group size and

covers topics ranging from our solar system, to the history of astrophysics, the life cycle of stars and our place in the universe.

For Cassie, who heard about the course from a friend, it was studying the big bang theory and how the universe was formed that really captured her imagination. It is a subject she is keen to pursue further through maths and sciences A Levels and eventually at university: "The Astronomy GCSE was as interesting as I had hoped – it's a subject that fascinates me. The STAR Centre provided exciting surroundings in which to study and it was great to have such an enthusiastic tutor who knew the subject so well."

The course welcomes astronomy enthusiasts of all ages and with different levels of experience who are keen to explore their interest on a deeper level.

Next month Diane, our Worth Valley Publishing distribution manager, is planning a 10 mile sponsored walk in the Worth Valley. The walk, now in it's 6th year, formerly known as Waggoners' Walk, supports the charity 'Embrace: Child Victims of Crime'.

A retired police officer, Diane has worked with children and families whose lives have been devastated by the criminal acts of others. Over the years while serving in active duty Diane requested support from Embrace when children had been left motherless through crime.

Jack was only 8 years old when his mother was unlawfully killed. After working on the case Diane referred Jack and his grandmother, Margaret to the charity.

Embrace aims to create new positive experiences for children and young people and to put some joy back in their lives. Jack and Margaret were treated to a special trip to Disneyland in Florida along with others who had suffered in similar ways. Afterwards, Margaret said, "We'd all gone through it a bit, what with the court case and what have you. The case finishing is like an anti-climax and then your life starts again. In Florida we went to Seaworld to see the dolphins and the whales and Jack wanted to sit at the front because the children all knew they would get wet through. It was not until we met up afterwards that we realised we'd both been crying our eyes out. When it was all done Jack had been crying all the time and I had been crying all the time. It was so emotional; the music and the whales. I felt better afterwards as though there had been a release. Jack told me he'd missed his mummy.

Maybe the show had been a trigger.'

Jack declared the whole trip 'Great!' and Margaret continued, 'He still talks about it and looks at the photographs. It was happy times. He thought of his mummy while he was there so it helped him in that way to talk about his mummy. I don't think he will ever forget it.'

Asked what the trip meant to her, Margaret said, 'It can make such a big difference to a family that has been through trauma. When you have a special time you keep going back in your mind to it and it gives you a lift. I never knew the police could be so kind because you do not hear about what happens behind the scenes. I've had my eyes opened. With what you go through you think they've got their conviction, everything is sorted and then you are forgotten. Well you are not forgotten. It is just good to know that they help the survivors.'

Seeing first hand the benefit of the charity's work, Diane made a personal

pledge to raise funds for Embrace so that there would always be money available for other children. So far, with the assistance of Worth Valley residents Mel and Rob from Oxenhope, and other friends, neighbours and police colleagues, both serving and retired, Diane has raised over £13,000.

This years walk has been aptly re-named the 'Wuthering Hike.' It will start (and finish) at The Wuthering Heights Pub in Stanbury at 10:30am on Sunday the 12th of October, 2014.

- * The walk covers high ground and rough terrain so you must be in good health and fit enough to complete the 10 miles.

- * Bring refreshments for the walk, also your mobile phone. You'll be able to buy a sandwich and cup of tea before you start and a meal at the end. There are also free refreshments en route.
- * A map of the route and detailed written directions will be provided on the day and the route itself will be marked.
- * It will be a great day, with every penny raised going directly to the charity.
- * There is no entry fee but the aim is to raise as much money as we can in sponsorship so please do your best.
- * Sponsorship money can be handed in on the day or later on to Diane, either as cash or as a cheque made payable to Embrace Child Victims of Crime.


